This Weeks Spotlight!


Year One & Two

In English, Year 1&2 have been busy this week planning their new 'Zog' stories. We have practised saying the story out loud to our friends and then created a new character to add into our own version. We even wrote some lovely dragon shape poems on Monday, using some rhyming words to make them even









better. In maths, we have been enjoying our shape topic. We have learnt the properties of 2D shapes and found lines of symmetry on them. We have also started to look at 3D shapes, learning about faces and edges. In RE, we completed our 'special people' topic and on Thursday we enjoyed our rejoice celebration, enjoying brownies and a chat with our friends. In geography, we researched and created a continents fact file. Learning the location of each continent on a world map and then finding some facts about them. In PE, we are having fun in our gymnastics. Practising lots of balancing and



movement skills and in science, we have been looking in depth at the season of summer, it reminded us how much we miss the warmer weather! Well done for another fantastic week Year 1&2!

Classroom News!

EYFS

This week in EYFS we have started a new text all about penguins. To begin with we had to investigate what type of animal it was, exploring vocabulary like; beak, feathers, wings and flippers. We the labelled a picture of an adult penguin and a chick. Throughout the week we have looked at non-fiction books and compared them to a story. Non-fiction tells the truth! In Maths we have explored mass and capacity. We have worked with the balance scales and spoke about heavier, lighter and balanced. We have also used cups to fill containers and estimated how many cups it would take to fill. This week we have also continued our geography theme in our foundation; looking at different places where animals live and the seasons. We went on a winter journey stick walk around the school grounds finding signs of winter. There wasn't much we could attach to our stick and we found it to be very cold and wet.

Year Three & Four Year 3 & 4 have worked particularly hard in maths this week, we are developing our fluency with times table and making connections to deepen our understanding. This week we focused on the connections between 2s, 4s and 8 times tables and how we can double factors and halve factors to find the product. In English we looked at features of a diary and created a diary entry for one of our Iron Man characters. In Science we introduced our new topic LIGHT and had fun investigating how light helps us see and how dark is the absence of light. In Geography we tried out Digimaps, a brilliant online maps for school programme, and found the 4 digit grid reference for various points. It was great to end the week with a visit to the church to celebrate the Pilgrimage of Hope Jubilee 2025 together.

Year Five & Six

Year 5/6 have been investigating the continent of South America this week. The children identified a range of countries, as well as their capital cities using an atlas (many had fun trying to pronoun the names). They also used an eight-point compass to identify the d cities direction from the location of Brasilia. The children also used the map to locate the four - digit grid references.


In English the children have been generating a toolkit for a science fiction text. They used a variety of sci-fi narratives that we have read through the week, to look for evidence of all the features of the text. The tool kit should be used to help write a science fiction narrative. In mathematics, they children are now using there knowledge of fractions to add and subtract them, as well as cancel them down to the lowest term.
