



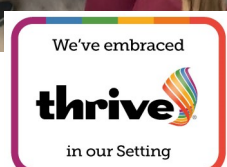

This Weeks Spotlight!

Year One & Two

What a lovely first week back after half term! In Year 1&2 we have been doing some really great addition work adding two 2-digit numbers and three 1-digit numbers together. The children have shown great resilience and a positive attitude to learning during all of our Maths lessons this week. In Geography, we have begun learning about the seven continents and five oceans. The children firstly used a globe and then an atlas to locate the continents and oceans of the world. In RE, we have been learning all about Lent. We had some special assemblies on Tuesday and Wednesday discussing Shrove Tuesday and Ash Wednesday. Then in class we enjoyed discussing why as Catholics and Christians we celebrate these special days. We were even lucky enough to enjoy eating some yummy pancakes and decorating some eggs for our Easter Tree. In English, we have started our new topic on a traditional fairy tale: Hansel and Gretel, the children enjoyed looking at several other fairy tale books, answering some comprehension questions about the story and thinking about how the children would feel. In Science, we have been super scientists investigating what animals we could see around the school grounds. Another fantastic week from all the children in Year 1&2. Well done!



Classroom News!

EYFS

In EYFS this week we have been looking at our books 'Mr Wolf's Pancakes' and talking about Mr Wolf turning over a new leaf. Then on Tuesday the children had pancakes to celebrate Shrove Tuesday, then we discussed what our favourite pancake topping was and made a bar chart to show our results. The children have been writing their Lenten Promises this week and talking about them in class.

Year Three & Four

This week in Year 3/4, we've been exploring measurement. We have been using rulers of all different lengths and sizes to measure a variety of different concrete objects. We've then been using our mathematical skills to convert between the different units of measurement. In PSHE we have been looking at what makes a modern-day hero special. The children have been looking at everyday heroes, that we might see in our day-to-day lives, and identifying what characteristics they all share. While in computing, we have been practicing composing short e-mail messages to fictional people. Well done on a brilliant first week back team!

Year Five & Six

The children have had a fantastic week in Year 5/6. We celebrated Shrove Tuesday with pancakes for the whole school and we received ashes on Wednesday for Ash Wednesday. We also completed our Lenten Promises to start us off on the right foot for the beginning of Lent.

In English, the children have been investigating how to blend action, dialogue and description into their writing, as well as developing a setting for a rainforest dilemma. In Maths, the children have been learning to add and subtract mixed number fractions. Unfortunately, the children had no swimming this week due to illness, but they are all looking forward to World Book Day on Wednesday.
