- Year One & Two Year 1&2 have had a very busy and exciting week! In Maths we have started to learn how to tell the time and Year 1 are mastering o'clock and half past, whilst Year 2 have also been learning about quarter to and quarter past. In English we have been researching some more endangered animals, which has been very thought provoking for the children and initiated some interesting and emotional discussions. In Design and Technology, we made our delicious carrot and sultana salad. The children enjoyed chopping, grating and mixing all of the fruit and vegetables.
