This Weeks Spotlight!

Year Three & Four

This week in Year 3/4, we've been exploring the character of Cruella DeVil in Dodie Smith's The Hundred and One Dalmatians. The children have been using the text to help them create a visual interpretation of what Cruella looks like. The children then compared that against the Disney live action remake - identify-

ing the similarities and differences. In PE, we have been learning how to pass the baton in relay races. The children worked in groups of fives to form a relay team. They've all shown lots of teamwork, good listening and focus during this activity. While in Geography, we have been using maps to help us identify the four-figure grid reference of different settlements in the Lake District. We then used the compass points to identify and locate nearby settlements. Well done on another brilliant week team!





Classroom News!

- **EYFS** This week in EYFS we have continued to look at celebrations from around the world. We have learned all about Burns night and Scotland. Then we made short-bread biscuits and listened to bagpipes. In Literacy, we children have been learning about poetry and rhyming words. In our writing books we have started to write simple sentences about characters from the books we know. The children's handwriting is fantastic! In Maths we have explored capacity and mass; using classroom objects to compare the amount we can fit into containers and cups to see how much water we can fit in them.
- Year One & Two Another fantastic week in Year 1&2! The children have been learning more about subtraction. They have been using manipulatives to support their understanding and some of them have been mastering more formal methods. In English, we have been using conjunctions, writing more questions and have started to plan our posters which will tell everyone about all the rat facts that we have learnt. In geography, the children now understand the difference between human and physical geographical features and are beginning to look at the Tawd Valley Country Park to find these features. In RE, we have been learning about the Eucharist and the 4 parts of a Mass. Well done Year 1&2!
- Year Five & Six Another busy week in Year 5/6. We have been exploring fractions, particularly equivalent fractions and ordering fractions on a number line. In English, we continue to read our novel of Good Night Mr. Tom, and the children have explored using modal verbs, questioning tags and colloquial language. In RE, the children have looked at the Old Testament and the Dead Sea Scrolls and investigated Bible references. In Geography we identified the hemispheres, the Tropics, as well as locating the Artic and the Antarctic.

On Tuesday night, some of the children attended the swimming gala and we had individual winners, as well as an overall third place - what a fantastic achievement. We also say goodbye to Miss Woodruff this week; she has been with the class since September, whilst completing her teacher training and she is moving on to another school to finish this off. All the children will miss her, and we wish her good luck.

One of our parents has made us aware of the following information concerning activities during the school holidays. By applying for a purple Blue Peter Badge you can have access to a discount at a number of attractions in the area, please see below:

The children can join the online fan club for the Purple Badge, with parental approval to gain the discounts, they can apply for it on the Blue Peter website:

upon completion of the online questionnaire, badges are issued after 6 weeks, followed by an ID card after an additional 6 weeks. This program is designed for children aged 5-15.


