## This Weeks Spotlight!

#### <u>Year 5 & 6</u>

Year 5/6 have been extremely busy this week getting ready for our upcoming performance , The Pirates of the Curry Bean. The children have been focusing on their lines, when to come on and go off the stage, as well as trying to use some actions. To help with our performance, the children have been learning many songs and creating many of the props and ideas for the stage (alongside Art Club, who have also been very helpful).

In PSHCE this week, the children were exploring how we accept everyone in the world regardless of the colour of





their skin, culture, race, creed, etc. We read a wonderful story about how a living thing was discriminated against and we discussed what actions and words should have been instead. In RE, the children have been developing their own ideas of a set of rules based upon the Beatitudes. The children created some beautiful ideas that the world could live by.

Our mathematics topic of area, perimeter and volume is now completed and all the children finished the unit of with an assessment which demonstrated how much that they have learnt over the last couple of weeks. Year 5/6 have also had super fun during our PE lesson of dance - we definitely have great movers and shakers.





#### **Classroom News!**

- EYFS This week in Maths, we have been learning about sharing and what number comes after or before another number. In Foundation subjects, we have started to look at Oceans and what things don't and do belong in the Ocean. In Literacy, we are starting to look at the seaside and we are exploring Non-fiction books. We have spoken about what we can see, hear, smell an touch at the seaside. In Re, we have talking about what makes a good friend and what can break a friendship. We have been on our school trip . All the children really enjoyed it. In our phonics, we have been looking at root words and adding 'ed'. In Nursery phonics, we have been looking at the x' sound and playing games.
- Year One & Two Year 1&2 have had a fantastic week. In English, we have been planning a revised part of our 'How to train a train' story. The children have then written them using their story maps to support them. In maths, we have been telling the time to quarter past and quarter to. We had so much fun on Wednesday when we started to make our pop-up books based on a fairytale. The children used all of their new skills to make their stories come to life. In art, we used watercolours to paint some Kente cloth patterns. We used different sized brushes and scales to see what worked best. We really enjoyed our sports day practise and are looking forward to the real thing next week. Well done Year 1&2!
- Year Three & In maths, the year 3 & 4 children have been looking at angles and lines. We have discussed horizontal, vertical, parallel and perpendicular lines and explored our classroom looking for examples. We completed our DT project this week by making healthy pizzas. The children made their own dough, kneaded the dough and stretched it out to for the base before piling on the healthy toppings they had selected in their design. The children were able to link their science lessons on nutrition and the Eatwell Plate to help them. In English, we have started our final modelled write of the year to transform the poem of The Spider and the Fly into a narrative thinking about inverted commas for speech and lots of lovely noun phrases. Finally, we had some excellent news about the year 4 MTC results confirming the children's hard work on times tables this year, achieving above the national average! Well done guys.
