### **EYFS**


We have had an exciting couple of weeks in EYFS!

Last week we had our trip to Windmill Animal Farm. The children had a wonderful time and were so well behaved. We had a talk from Farmer Paul, who then took us to feed the lambs. After that we fed lots of different animals including goats, sheep and even alpacas. Farmer Paul then took us to see lambs that had been born the night before and we were able to stroke one. After that we went to the critter hour and got to hold a gecko, snake and a tarantula! All the children were very brave. We also went on the farm train which was exciting!

This week in Literacy, we continued to look at nursery rhymes and sang Hickory Dickory Dock. We concentrated on rhyming words and wrote new verses to the song. We have also been looking at where things are placed in Maths and Literacy, using phrases like; behind, above, in front, in between and below to describe its location. Also, this week we have started our new topic of DT and this time we are looking at how food is made. We discussed our likes and dislike and then created a healthy plate of food. On Thursday, something exciting happened! One of our caterpillars emerged from its chrysalis, hopefully in the next couple of days more will emerge and eventually we will release them!

### **Classroom News!**

Year One & Two

What a week we have had in Year 1&2! On Monday, we had a fantastic trip to Knowsley Safari Park. The weather was lovely, the animals were amazing and the company was even better. The children (and staff) enjoyed every part of the trip but highlights were the sea-lion show and the birds of prey. Then, on Tuesday we had a visit from the ice cream van. Children and their families were treated to an ice cream or ice lolly as a thank you for supporting the school and its children through our journey. We also did some fantastic learning throughout the week. In English, we started our new book 'The Bog Baby', we asked questions and made predictions about what might happen. In Art, we created some beautiful collages ready for our final piece of work next week and in RE, we have been exploring what things we treasure both in our personal lives and in the world around us. Well done Year 1&2!

Year Three & Four

This week, we have used a variety of shapes to calculate both their perimeters and areas in our Maths lessons. We have used a variety of factors for classifying animals in our Science work (eg 'Do they have tusks or feathers?). In our RE work, we have begun to examine how ordinary people are capable of doing extraordinary things.

Year Five & Six

This week Year 5/6 have been exploring how exercise affects your heart rate and discussing the benefits of exercise. The children recorded their pulse rates after exercise and then repeated the activity, looking at resting heart rate. In Religious Education, the children have been exploring the 'Common Good'. In this unit, the children have discussed how we, as human being and Christians, help others in the world how aren't not so fortunate as us. The children understand how we work in solidarity with others to support each other.

WE have finished our 'Monet' unit in Arty & Design and the children have now begun their new Design Technology project - Maxine Clark 'Build-a-bear. The children have been investigating the owner of the company and looking a her designs. They have also investigated zoo animals, as our design brief is to make a zoo animal plushie - some of the designs so far are wonderful.
