EYFS

This week in EYFS we have continued to look at our book Doing Your Best. We have talked about how it is giving instructions on how to be the best we can be. We have made a list of all the different things we need instructions for. As a class we ordered some instructions on how to make a jam sandwich, we made sure our instructions and ingredients were clear. On Friday we followed our instructions and made our jam sandwiches.

In Maths the children have been matching, comparing and sorting items. They have been able to identify whether objects match or don't match, sort objects by a rule and explain to the other children what their sorting rule is and to identify if groups have more than, fewer than or the same about of objects.

On Wednesday we went for an autumn walk around our school grounds. the children spoke about what they could see, hear and feel. we collected items that reminded us of autumn and attached them to our journey stick, The children enjoyed noticing the changes that were happening around them.

In History, we started learning about a famous cricketer from the 1930's called Learie Constantine who lived in Lancashire. We went on a nature walk around the school grounds to see God's beautiful creations during RE. Well done Year 1&2.

Year Three & Four

This week in Year 3/4, we've been exploring a hidden tomb in Ancient Egypt. The children have used VR to explore the tomb of Queen Nefertari and pose some difficult questions to the archaeologists that discovered her tomb. In RE, we have been reflecting on times that we have been chosen. While in swimming this week, the children have been practicing doing full lengths! It's been a brilliant week, well done Team!

Year Five & Six

Year 5/6 have been extremely busy this week writing their own narrative adventure set in Baghdad. The children have focused on using cohesion to link their ideas together, fronted adverbials for where and when and using an expanded noun phrase to help with detail. In Mathematics, we have come to the end of our place value unit and next week we will be moving on to calculating the four operations.

In RE, the children have completed their domestic church unit and the have discussed how and why our parents and God show us unconditional love. In History, we explore the life of Ibn Battuta - the children were very intrigued by his journey of 75, 000 miles.
