# This Weeks Spotlight! Year One & Two

What a wonderfully busy and exciting week we've had in Year 1!

We began the week by celebrating St. Edmund's Mission Statement Day. Together, we explored our mission statement, discussing what it really means to us in our everyday lives. The children thought carefully about how they can show kindness, patience and respect both in and out of the classroom. To finish, the children decorated their own stars to represent themselves. We talked about how each star is unique, just like each of us, but when we come together, we shine even brighter as a class family.

In English, we have been continuing our journey with the story The Way Home for Wolf. The children have been working hard on sequencing the events in the correct order and using key vocabulary from the text to help retell the story. We also discussed the emotions Wilf might have felt at different points on his journey, thinking about how we would feel in his place. The children ended the week by writing a diary entry in role as Wilf.

Science saw us turning into real scientists for the day! We carried out an investigation to find the best material to make an umbrella. The children made predictions before testing, then carefully observed what happened when water was poured onto each material. They recorded their results and came to a conclusion about which material was the most waterproof. It was wonderful to see their enthusiasm and curiosity throughout the experiment, there were lots of thoughtful conversations and some excellent teamwork.

In Maths, our focus has been on comparing numbers. To help us, we met some very greedy crocodiles! The children learned how to use the symbols for greater than, less than, and equal to. We practised with numbers, objects, and even had some fun challenges where the crocodile had to choose between two sets of snacks. The children are becoming confident with recognising the symbols and remembering that the crocodile always wants the bigger number!

In History, we were introduced to Learie Constantine, a famous cricketer and inspiring figure who made a difference both on and off the cricket field. The children enjoyed learning a little about his life and achievements, and we also began to explore the game of cricket. The class is very excited at the idea of trying out a mini game of cricket themselves next week it should be lots of fun!



#### **Classroom News!**

#### Year One & Two

This week in FSU we have been learning about Autumn and the signs of Autumn we see around us during the season. We had lots of fun when we went on a scavenger hunt to find leaves, acorns and conkers and the children enjoyed using magnifying glasses to look closely at the items they found. As part of our Home Sweet Home topic, FSU looked at maps of the local area and they were able to identify some local landmarks. The children also drew some super maps of the local area and they were able to talk about what they had drawn.

Reception have continued to make brilliant progress in phonics and this week we learnt the sounds ck,u,e,r. The children have also been practising reading CVC words and they are becoming more confident when blending and segmenting sounds. In maths, Reception have been looking at simple AB patterns and enjoyed making repeated patterns using musical instruments and objects. Nursery have continued to work on identifying colours and have explored matching and finding pairs of objects. Well done FSU, keep up the good work!

Year Three & Four In Year 3 and 4 this week, we've been rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000 in Maths, and in English we finished our modelled magazine article on Loch Ness, ready for our independent writes full of fascinating facts next week! Our grammar focus has been using when and until to improve sentences. In PSHE, we joined the whole school in thinking about our mission statement, choosing "reaching our full potential" and creating magnificent wings to remind us we can fly high when we try our best. Reading routines are also well underway – well done to everyone regularly using Collins Hub or Reading Plus!

#### Year Five & Six

This week Year 5/6, the children have been exploring Ibn Batutta in History. They have discovered about the man himself as well as his journeys across the Silk Road trading goods and how he travelled for many many years across Arabia. He is very significant during the early Islamic period due to his travel but also his recorded travels, which the children used as a source of evidence. In RE, the children have created an acrostic poem about all the things that they have learnt during our loving unit.

In English, the children are gathering all their information to develop and plan their own fictional narrative, which will be set in a magical emporium of their own. They have been collecting a wide range of vocabulary and ideas to make their writing very exciting. Our mathematics this week has involved lots of mental strategies. The children have been exploring many ways to add and subtract mentally.
