



# <u>EYFS</u>

What an exciting week it has been in the FSU! We have been very busy with our Christmas preparations. We have been making some special decorations for a our Christmas craft café and doing some wonderful art work for our school Christmas displays. The children have also been busy rehearsing for their Nativity. They have done very well at learning all the songs. We got to practise in the hall with year 1 and 2 and some of us even got to go on the stage. On Thursday morning, we arrived at school to find our classroom in such a mess. There were Christmas decorations everywhere! We also found a letter and special visitor; one of Father Christmas' elves! The elf told the children that she is going to be watching them and then reporting back to Father Christmas every day so the children must try extra hard to follow our St Edmund's values of 'Consideration, Care and Courtesy.' The children used the Christmas decorations to make our tree and classroom look beautiful, all ready for Christmas.



## **Classroom News!**

- Year One & Two This week we have been busy practising for our Nativity performance. The children have shown great patience, determination and resilience learning all of the songs and their lines. In Maths, we have been using money to solve problems, practising number fluency and recognising odd and even numbers. We really enjoyed our trip to St Richard's Church on Wednesday, we got to sing some songs, show reverence and pray to God. Well done Year 1&2!
- Year Three & Four This week in Year 3/4, we've been exploring Roman Mosaics. The children have been experimenting with their drawing and painting to create an initial design of their own underwater mosaics. The children have been using different types of pencils to sketch their design, then using the watercolours, they have been exploring how to create different colours, textures and tones. Finally, the children have used different bits of coloured card to construct their Roman Mosaic. The final outcomes are absolutely brilliant! In English, we have continued the Roman theme and begun to explore our information text "Romans, Gods, Emperors and Dormice". The text tells us lots of information about the Roman; how they lived, what they believed in and why they went to war. The children have all really enjoyed exploring this text. On Friday, we all got our first taste of forest school. It was lots of fun we didn't let the cold weather spoil it for us! Well done on a fab week, team. See you all Monday!
- Year Five & Six We have had a very busy week in Year 5/6. We've put up our Christmas tree, decorated angels for our Advent display and made beautiful Christmas cards. We have also been investigating prime, square and cubed numbers in Maths and identifying the conventions of playscripts. In RE, we have been writing an instruction leaflet for making an Advent wreath. During our visit to St Richard's Catholic Church, the children were an absolute delight. Our Gospel and bidding prayer readers were fantastic, all the children made Y5/6 staff extremely proud.
