This Weeks Spotlight!

EYFS

We have had a visitor this week in EYFS, Barnaby Bear. He has travelled to India to help us explore the country and compare the differences between here and there. The children have also been talking about where they come from and where their families come from; talking about how we celebrate and different traditions. The children have used the construction area to build transport for Barnaby to different places.

They have also been playing traditional children's games from India and found that some of the games were the same as ours!

In Maths this week the children have been exploring double numbers and patterns. As a class we have looked at how all double numbers make even numbers and they have a flat top, whereas odd numbers have an odd one sticking up. The children then created their own ABAB patterns using different objects.

Year One & Two

Year 1&2 have finished writing their 'Rainbow Fish' stories this week and have enjoyed spending time editing their work, looking for any missing full stops and capital letters. Some of the children even used dictionaries to correct their spelling mistakes. In Maths, we have started to learn how to tell the time, and I must say I have been very impressed by how much some of the Year 2 children have remembered from last year. We have been thinking about the words before and after, we have looked at days of the week and months of the year and also telling the time to the hour and half past. The children finished their sculptures from our art topic and have evaluated what they thought went well and how they could improve it if they

Year Three & Four This week in Year 3/4, we have been exploring statistics. In our Maths sessions, we looked at different types of graphs - including bar graphs and pictographs - and answering questions about the data being presented. In Art, we have been creating sculptures based on our focus artist's work. While in English, we have been writing our own traditional tales. In PE this week, we had lots of fun practicing our rugby skills. The children took turns being attackers and defenders. The defenders had to try and rip the tags away from the attacker - who themselves were trying to collect as many points as possible. Well done team on a brilliant week!

Year Five & Six

Year 5/6 have gone performance crazy this week! I am so proud of them all trying to learn their lines and remembering when to exit and enter the stage. I am sure that you will enjoy it.

In addition to our rehearsals, the children had a week full of fun and learning... Including, finalising and building their 'Bug Hotels' in Design Technology (which were fabulous), as well as beginning our new Art project. We are investigating an artist named Kurt Schwitter, who is famous for his works in collage. The children have analysed his work this week and we will be moving on to design our own in the same fashion.

In RE, the children have completed their Freedom & Responsibility unit, where they have began to develop an understanding of the Ten Commandments and the Beatitudes. In swimming, the children all made a big push to achieve their goals for the end of the year - most of our children can now swim a whole length and more! In Forest school, the children have been having fun exploring the grounds, cooking and learning many outdoor learning skills.
