EYFS

This week in EYFS we had a visitor form the top of the beanstalk! The Giant had come to our classroom and walked all over our carpet spaces! The children read Jack and the Beanstalk and we talked about how the characters feel in different parts of the story. In Maths we have been looking at weight, length, capacity and height and using lots of resources to help us measure. The children have been watching their sunflowers closely and some have started to grow!

Year One & Two

Year 1&2 have enjoyed the last week of term. We have been planning a new setting and a new character in English. In Maths, we have been learning more about equal groups, doubles and multiplication. In Geography, we spent time looking at aerial photographs. Identifying physical and human features and in Science we tested our senses. In RE we finished learning about the Easter story. Focusing on Easter Sunday and Jesus rising from the dead. The children enjoyed planting some seeds to signify new life and I am looking forward to seeing the giant sunflower pictures in a few months' time. Enjoy your Easter break from Year 1&2!

Year Five & Six

Another busy week this week in year 5/6. We have had a visit from two local police officers, who were discussing how to keep safe when the children are playing out of an evening or at the weekend, as well as helping them understand the benefits of always making the right choices in our lives. In English, we have completed our free verse poem based on the theme 'deforestation' and they are wonderful, they are filled with lots of examples of figurative language and expanded noun phrases for detail.

In mathematics, we have been developing our skills in ratio and proportion and we have applied these skills to help the children solve a range of word problems. In Science, we have been investigating puberty and how the human body changes over the life-cycle. After a few giggles and red faces, the children really enjoyed the session. Finally, we have some extremely talented artists in Year 5/6 and quiet a few of of sketches of our 'rainforest jungle' theme pictures were amazing - well done!
