This Weeks Spotlight! EYFS

What a busy week back at school we have had! We continued our learning about Baptisms. We looked at a picture of a Baptism and talked about what we could see happening. The children then role played the Baptism and took turns playing the different parts. In Maths, reception have been learning the meaning of the word 'equal' they had to make sure that all the bears had equal amounts of food for a teddy bears picnic. The nursery children have been practising their counting. In P.E, the children showed what fantastic gymnasts they are. They explored moving their bodies in different ways doing lots of different types of rolls. As part of our end of topic celebration we were talking about how we could make people feel welcome in our class. The children decided they would write invitations to the Year one children and invite them to our class to play. We had cakes and music. It was lots of fun!

- Year One & Two Year 1&2 have had a lovely first week back. We started reading 'Zog' which is our new book in English. We have asked questions, made predictions and talked about the main character. We also began our new History topic on toys. The children enjoyed talking about their own toys, what they like to play with and why. In Maths, we have been consolidating more than, less than and ordering objects and numbers. We even managed to squeeze in some amazing firework art! Well done Year 1&2 for a great first week back.
- Year Three & Four This week in Year 3/4, we've been exploring our new focus text in English -Queen of Darkness. The story is about Boudica, a Queen from Britannia who wants to stop the Roman invasion. The children this week have been advising Boudica on what she should do... should she attack the Romans or run for safety? While in History, we've been exploring the reason why Emperor Claudius decided to invade Britain. In art, we've begun to look at some ancient Roman mosaics. The children have all worked very hard this week! Well done on a brilliant first week back!
- Year Five & Six Welcome back everyone, I hope you all had a good rest over the half term. The children have definitely been full of energy and excitement this week, due to Halloween and Bonfire Night on Saturday. Yet, they have still been working extremely hard, especially in Mathematics. The children have been using their tables knowledge to help them multiply 4-digit number by a 2-digit number. We did find this quite challenging at first, but they continued onwards and upwards and demonstrated a lot of resilience. In English, we have been exploring many of the grammatical areas that we need to be able to write a biography. We have investigated, paragraphing, cohesion, fronted adverbials and research and gathering lots of information by skimming and scanning.

In topic, the children have been gathering the key areas of learning of the Anglo-Saxons and Scots and putting together a media presentation for their peers. They will communicate their findings to each other. In RE, we are discussing commitment and how we commitment to our families , each other and God.
