This week we have been learning all about the Easter story and the Stations of the Cross. In Maths, Nursery and Reception have been looking at shapes; the names of them and what features they have. Reception used the 3-D shapes to print the different faces and see what 2-D shapes they are made of. We have also been doing lots of Easter crafts in class, practicing our cutting skills and using different stencils to draw Easter eggs. Have a wonderful Easter Holiday and a welldeserved rest!

Year One & Two

On Monday the Year 1&2 children started the week off leading the first 'Stations of the Cross' assembly and they all read beautifully. In English, we have enjoyed reading the rest of our book 'The Tale of Peter Rabbit'. We have started innovating our own stories with new character names and escape methods. In maths, we have been completing some mixed addition and subtraction 2-digit calculations and counting in 2,s. In geography, we finished our 'Continents and Oceans' topic off by creating a classroom map and in PE, we enjoyed more cricket, agility and gymnastics work. In RE, we have finished learning about the Easter Story. How Jesus was crucified on Good Friday and rose from the dead on Easter Sunday. Have a great Easter break Year 1&2!

Year Five & Six A very exciting week in Year 5/6 this week. The children have been looking forward to watching a movie and popcorn after their winning attendance award. It was a success, and the children really enjoyed watching the movie version of Hugo - which has been our class novel for 4 weeks.
