## **This Weeks Spotlight!**

#### **EYFS**

What a busy couple of weeks EYFS have had. Last week we went on our class trip to Imagine That! Everyone had a brilliant time (including the adults!) We explored the science zone in the morning, which had a dark room where we could write with lights, a water section where we had to fish for gold and there was an area we could make paper airplanes that we then could fly. After all that, we went to a science show and watched a magic of dry ice and even had snow. Then we went to make our own never melting snow and then made some slime. After lunch we were able to explore the imagination zone and we could pretend to be builders, vets, hairdressers and perform on a stage! Then we went to the art zone where we made bath bombs, painted fridge magnets and then painted a real car! In the outdoor area we spoke about the seasons and were able to use the construction equipment in the sand.

This week we started off with Sports day on Monday. The children worked really hard and enjoyed taking part in the races and cheering on their houses. In Literacy we have continued to look at our non-fiction book about the seaside. We have looked at the life cycle of a shark as we found out you can find mermaid's purses (shark eggs) on the beach! Reception also wrote a fact file on a hermit crab using all the information they have discovered. In Maths, Reception have been looking at sharing and grouping items, thinking about can even or odd items can be shared equally. In Nursery, we have been consolidating our understanding of the number five, matching numerals to amounts. In DT the children have continued to look bridges and what they are made out of, then on Friday we designed our own bridge ready to make for next week. We have also been on our final Journey Stick walk of the year, collecting items that remind us of summer. We spoke about the changes happening this season and how everything is more colourful. We also harvested our potatoes and made crisps and potato salad with them. They were very yummy!

Year One & Two

In English Year 1&2 have been learning how to use apostrophes for possession, decide on names and characteristics for our pet trains and wrote a guidebook on how to look after it. In maths, we are continuing to learn how to tell the time. This is a really tricky topic but the children are feeling more confident and showing great resilience. In design and technology, we continued our pop up books inspired by Robert Sabuda. The children have been making springs, levers and sliders as well as using other skills they have learnt. Our dance in PE is now nearly completed and I am proud of how they are remembering all of the choreography. We enjoyed a nature walk in science to see how many different types of trees we could spot around the school grounds and in RE we have been thinking about our neighbours all around the world. Well done Year 1&2 for a great week!

Year Three & Four

Year 3 and 4 have had a wonderful week of learning, broken up by sports day, a fantastic zoo trip and a celebratory picnic. In maths the children have finished their unit on Shape looking at different lines, angles and polygons. In English, we have completed our modelled write on the Spider and the Fly and next week we will begin to innovate on this ready for our final piece of independent writing. In music, we are doing really well with the recorder and hoping to work towards a performance of our song 'You've Got a Friend'. Finally, in art the children have finished their 3D sculptures, manipulating the clay and adding detail with some fabulous results. Keep reading everyone and have a good weekend!

Year Five & Six

Year 5/6 have been exploring our new art topic this week - they have been exploring an artist named Suzie Mackenzie. They have researched all about her life and created a fabulous two-page spread showing many forms of her artwork, as well as the prints that she has created using collography. In Science the children have been investigating the living things that live all around the school grounds. They have recorded these in frequency tables and discussed which kingdom each animal belongs to. In Pe, the children have been putting the final part of their small group dance routine together - all the children have participated and they are having a lot of fun.

Rehearsals are going well, and the children are looking forward to next week to be able to show their acting and drama skills. They have worked extremely hard, and the rest of the school are looking forward to watching on Tuesday afternoon. Parent showing is on Thursday 10th July at 5pm. Sports day was lots of fun and the children demonstrated great teamwork skills, as well as determination and resilience.

#### Blue Peter—Book Badge




