This Weeks Spotlight!

Year One & Two

This week we have been so busy, using some fantastic mathematical vocabulary and symbols to compare objects and numbers. In English, we have been learning more about dinosaurs and writing some fact files to help us with our non-chronological reports next week. The children are really enjoying this topic and are telling me lots of interesting facts about the dinosaurs. In RE, we enjoyed our rejoice celebration, reflecting on what we had learnt over the last few weeks about the creation story and all new beginnings. In science, we were testing some materials to see if they could be stretched, squashed, bent or twisted. In History, we learnt more about the famous cricketer Learie Constantine who lived in Lancashire back in the 1930's. The children were discussing what life was like for him and his family when they moved here from Trinidad and Tobago. Well done on another fantastic week Year 1&2!



Classroom News!

- **EYFS** This week in EYFS we have been looking at our poem Fire and talking about words that rhyme. The children have tried really hard to identify what words sound the same and matched them together. The children also spoke about how the poem was about autumn by looking at the pictures surrounding it. This week in Maths our new topic has been measure, weight and capacity. the children have explored bigger and smaller, heavier and lighter, full and empty. They have then used these skills in continuous provision and compared items. In history we have continued to look at our home topic and have spoken about toys in the past and toys now. We focused on what the toys are made of and how different this is, we then went on a material hunt around the FSU area labelling the different materials.
- Year Three & Four This week in Year 3/4, we've been creating our of Egyptian fairy tales based on the classic tale, Cinderella. The children have each created a 5-part story that retells the adventure of an Egyptian girl who is saved by an almighty God and whisked away to meet her handsome Pharaoh! In Maths, we have been partitioning numbers up to 10,000. While in Computing, the children have been programming their own fish tank using coding software their work was very impressive. To end the week, the children have had lots of fun in their swimming and forest school sessions. Well done team!
- Year Five & Six In Year 5/6 this week the children have been exploring figurative language in English - they have been identifying similes, metaphors and personification. We have also read a wide read of poems from Pie Corbett to Ogden Nash. In Mathematics, we have begun looking at using the inverse with addition and subtraction. Our RE is about vocation and the people that complete a job volunteering or paid in the name of God. We also have some fantastic cricketers this week in PE, they demonstrated many skills and excellent role models for sportsmanship. Hopefully everyone saw our picture of Lancashire's Fantastic Book Awards, our team will represent our school at an awards ceremony in May. The whole class will listen / read 5 books and cast their votes in February.

I always walk around the school to see the children and how much they learning.
