Year One & Two

It's been a great first week back after half term! The Year 1&2 children have enjoyed starting to learn about our new artist 'Gabi Jimenez', they have already been drawing self-portraits, using bold thick lines and lots of bright colours. In English, we have taken a magic carpet ride to a 'whole new world'. The children have planned the things they will see and do when they are there and are now writing their own stories. In Maths, we have been learning more vocabulary around our topic on position and direction. The children are now more confident with their left and right and the terms clockwise and anti-clockwise. In RE, we have been talking about the importance of rules and what happens when they are broken. The children have written letters of apology in role and even come up with their own prayer. In PE, we welcomed Miss Rimmer who will be teaching us more about our fundamental movement skills over the next 7 weeks. This week we enjoyed 'dodging' and aiming our shots. Well done Year 1&2 for another fantastic week!

Classroom News!

EYFS We have had a busy first week back in EYFS. We have started to look at our new book Sharing a Shell. The children have thought about how the characters are friends and what makes a good friend. In Maths the children have been exploring shapes and how we can use shapes to make pictures. We have also been investigating shapes within other shapes and what shapes we can put together to make others. Also, this week we had a special delivery! Our caterpillars have been delivered! Over this term we will be watching them form cocoons and change into butterflies, eventually being able to release them.

Year Three & Four This week, years 3 and 4 have been looking into Folk Tales. We also worked out some of the unusual vocabulary these include. In Maths, we looked at the clockwise and anti-clockwise movement of a variety of shapes.

For the 80th anniversary of the D-Day landings, we looked at why these events were so important. We also tried a WWII puzzle picture that primary children in 1944 would have tried out.

Year Five & Six This week Year 5/6 have been exploring our new artist for this half term. The children have been researching Claude Monet and finding out lots of information about his personal life, life as an artist, as well as the style and format of his artwork. Alongside this, the children have been using a variety of tools to observe and sketch waterlilies.

> In RE, the children have been discussing healing and the role of the church when people are ill or sick within our parish. We have read the parable of 'The Good Samaritan' and discussed our role as Christians to those who are sick. The children have investigated the role of the priest when anointing the sick and why people are anointed with oil.

> In English, the children have been predicting what they think will happen next in our class novel. The Case of the Murder of Miss Bell has developed some wonderful theories.
