This Weeks Spotlight!

EYFS

This week Reception have been learning about number and they have looked at the composition of the numbers 6,7 and 8. Using loose parts the children explored different ways to make the numbers 6,7 and 8. The children have also practised finding one more and one less and they sang the nursery rhyme 'One Man went to Mow' and used unifix cubes to build towers to show one more. Nursery this week, have continued to look at shapes and they have described everyday objects using the vocabulary pointy, flat and curved. They have also compared shapes and found two shapes that were both curved or flat.

In literacy the Reception and Nursery children have continued to look at the story the Queen's Hat and we have been creating our own sentences for the story using local landmarks. The children had lots of fun using actions to practise saying their sentences before drawing pictures to help them remember each of the words in their sentences.

This week Pre-school have enjoyed looking at the story 'Oh Dear' by Rod Campbell and they had lots of fun using paint and sponge stamps to create prints of the farm animals in the story. They also enjoyed listening to and singing the songs 'Old MacDonald Had A Farm' and 'Five Little Ducks Went Swimming One Day'.

The children also had fun during their second session at Forest School with Mrs Fletcher and they enjoyed digging in the mud and learning about all the plants and vegetables growing in our Forest School classroom.

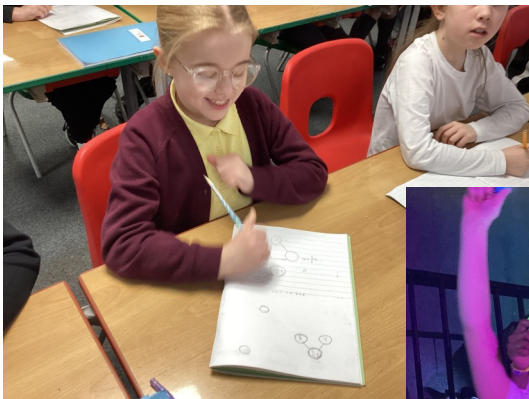


Year Five and Six Spotlight!

Year 5/6 had another very busy week. The children have been exploring the setting of a scene within a multitude of classic fiction texts; this week we have look at *The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe*. The children had to build a bank of words to describe the scene where Edward comes out of the wardrobe into the snowy scenes of Narnia. Each child wrote a descriptive setting, using metaphorical language, adjectives and noun phrases to build atmosphere in the scene. In mathematics, the children have returned to their favourite aspects of the maths curriculum - fractions! They are all very confident in adding and subtracting fractions, we are now moving on to multiplying fraction and whole numbers together.

Our Geography topic has been exploring weather zones this week. The children have discovered that the world has different temperature zones and these are affected by the position of the earth and the equator, as well as the tropics. The Everglades is within a sub-tropical climate zone, due to the heat and the humidity of the region.

The excitement has reached fever pitch this week in our class, as we have had children represent the school for the swimming gala, not forgetting our Year 4 child also. The children beat all the other schools to secure first place - what a fantastic achievement. Not only that, the children have also visited the CO-OP Live arena on Thursday to participate in the Young Voices 2026.

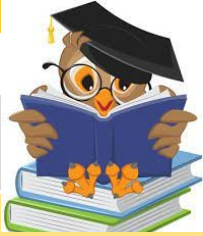
