This Weeks Spotlight!

EYFS

What an exciting first week back we have had. On Monday a mysterious treasure chest appears in the classroom full of things from the ocean. We discussed who could have left it there and why. To help us with our vocabulary, we used a word map to help us describe what we had found in the treasure chest, where we might see and how it may be used. We also read the poem Commotion in the Ocean and created actions for the poem to help us remember it. For our writing, Reception children looked at an ocean scene and used their fantastic sounding out to write sentences describing the scene.

For Maths this week in Reception we have started working on number sentences and how they help us add numbers and take away numbers from each other. We used cubes and first, next and then boards to support us in using number sentences. In Nursey, the children have been recapping their knowledge of sequencing and positioning. The children used position cards to put the teddy in different places around the chair.

We have also started our new Art topic of primal painting. We looked at different samples of primal painting; using a hammer to press flowers and spices with water and the different effects they have. We also sang our colour mixing rhyme ho help us remember what colours we mix to make new ones.





Classroom News!

Year One & Two What a great first week back in Year 1&2! We have started our new art topic on 'Kente Cloth'. The children learnt about what it is and who might wear it. They enjoyed creating their own patterns and colouring them in using colours to represent different meanings. We also started our new design and technology topic on 'pop up books' we looked at some books made by our designer Robert Sabuda and we are very excited to learn how to make some pop ups of our own over the next few weeks. In English, we have been writing sentences and learning how to edit our work and in maths we have been learning about half and quarter fractions. In science, we enjoyed planting some seeds and in RE we discussed how to say sorry and ask for forgiveness like Levi did. Well done Year 1&2!

Year Three & Four

In Maths, this week we have started to look at decimals, specifically tenths 0.1 and hundredths 0.01. The children have tackled this well and we continue with this maths topic into next week. The year 4 students have been working hard for their MTC next week. We have practiced the test plenty of times and the children are well prepared. In English, we have started one of my favourite books, 'The Spider & the fly'. We have made predictions about what will happen and deciphered the old language used. I look forward to the next few weeks as we delve deeper into this classic poem and work towards creating our own narrative based on it. Our new DT and Art projects are underway. In DT, we are looking at making healthy pizzas and in Art the children are studying a German artist famous for his sketching and sculptures.

Year Five & Six

Year 5/6 have been completing their final writing assignment within our inventors and inventions unit. The children have developed their own invention and composed an explanation text describing the machine in detail. Also, within this piece of writing the children also included a complex sentence using a relative pronoun and using parenthesis to add detail. In mathematics, the children have been exploring measuring the area inside a range of shapes. They have been looking at using a formula and applying it to calculate the area.

In DT, the children have began exploring an entamologist named Charles Rothschid. He is the inspiration behind the study of insects and developing suitable habitats for them . The children will be developing their own bug hotel. Finally, the children are very excited about our new end of year performance, 'The Pirates of the Curry Bean'. They have had the opportunity to read through scene one and develop their character a little.

Reminder

Just a gentle reminder in relation to holidays:

If you want to take your child our of school for a holiday if their attendance is 96% or above, you will not be fined.

If the time the children are absent for is 4 and a half days within a 10 week period, you will not be fined.

If you take your child out of school and their attendance is below 96% or they are absent for more than 4 and a half days within a 10 week period, you will be fined. If you are away for 3 days and then 2 days at a separate occasion within a 10 week period you will be fined. Most schools will fine even if a child's attendance is over 96%. We at, St. Edmund's, have made the decision not fine if a children's attendance is 96% or above because we want to work with parents.


