# This Weeks Spotlight!

## Year Five & Six

Year 5/6 has had a fun filled and tiring week! We had the swimming gala, where a range of children from our class represented the school and they were very successful! We had plenty of medals and the boys also came second in the relay - a fabulous effort.

We also had forest school this week, where the children had an opportunity to build a fire and then proceeded to make vegetable noodles on the fire. The children also made slate arrowheads with resources found in the forest school. To finish their session the children planed some new saplings to help to continue our forest school to flourish.

In English, the children have been exploring figurative language, and we had developed our understanding of metaphors, personification and similes. We have also had an opportunity to read a range of exciting science fiction poems and settings.

In Mathematics, we came to the end of our fraction unit and the children really enjoyed it. The children can now use fractions to add and subtract, as well as convert from a mixed







number to an improper fraction.



### Year Three and Four Attendance Reward

## **Classroom News!**

EYFS

In EYFS this week we had been looking at the nursery rhyme; Five Little Ducks Went Swimming One Day. We have been counting the ducks and using our knowledge to take one away each time. We have used props to retell the rhyme and act it out. Also, we looked at rhyming words and played a game of Slimey Rhymes to help us match the words. In Maths, Reception has been looking at one more and one less and the composition of the numbers to 9. We have used lots of rhymes to help us take away and add one more, we used our ten-frames to show this. In Nursery, we have continued to look at the number four and how we can make it. This week we have also spoke about how we can be friend with others even if they are different, just like the Blue Chameleon in the book we read. Finally, we have been looking at a map of the UK and the different countries it has. We have also been speaking about where we live, our address and how we get to school.

Year One & Two Year 1&2 have been busy this week writing their own versions of a familiar story. They planned new characters and changed certain features of the story to make it their own. In PE, we have enjoyed a session on throwing and catching, preparing us for our cricket lessons and in gymnastics we have been performing different travels and balances. In maths, we have been checking our understanding of tens and ones and matching number sentences and representations. In geography, we have learnt about the UK, its countries and the oceans that surround us. In science, we have learnt about the season of winter and in computing, we enjoyed playing some mathematics games. Well done Year 1&2 for another fantastic week!

Year Three & Four This week in English we began to innovate on The Iron Man by creating our own mysterious creatures and the chaos they brought to the town. We practiced different sentence starters to keep our writing interesting & explored lots more adverbs.

In maths, we began to look at measure and in science we explored materials to see which reflected light and which didn't. As it was Child Mental Health week, we took some time out to share what we like about each other and reminded ourselves we are a terrific group of kids.

# Chicken Pox Advice

#### Do

- drink plenty of fluid (try ice lollies if your child is not drinking) to avoid dehydration
- take <u>paracetamol</u> to help with pain and discomfort
- cut your child's fingernails and put socks on their hands at night to stop them scratching
- ✓ use cooling creams or gels from a pharmacy
- speak to a pharmacist about using <u>antihistamine medicine</u> to help itching
- bathe in cool water and pat the skin dry (do not rub)
- dress in loose clothes

#### Don't

- do not use <u>ibuprofen</u> unless advised to do so by a doctor, as it may cause serious skin infections
- X do not give aspirin to children under 16
- X do not go near newborn babies, or anyone who is pregnant or has a weakened immune system, as chickenpox can be dangerous for them
- imes do not scratch the spots, as scratching can cause scarring

#### Speak to a GP if:

- you're not sure it's chickenpox
- · you're concerned about your child

Tell the receptionist you think it might be chickenpox before going in to a GP surgery.

#### Get advice from 111 now if:

- the skin around the chickenpox blisters is hot, painful and red, but redness may be harder to see on brown or black skin
- your child has chickenpox and is <u>dehydrated</u>
- chickenpox symptoms suddenly get worse
- you're pregnant and have not had chickenpox before, or you're not sure, and you've been near someone with chickenpox
- you have a weakened immune system and have been near someone with chickenpox
- you think your newborn baby has chickenpox

Some people may be able to take medicine to prevent complications. It needs to be started within 24 hours of the spots appearing.

111 will tell you what to do. They can arrange a phone call from a nurse or doctor if you need one.
