Year Three & Four

We started the week dressed as our favourite book character and looked fantastic! We finished our class read Bills New Frock and researched a little about Anne Fine the author.

I am very proud of year 3 & 4, they have worked alongside adults to identify their skills in maths and reading. Excellent attitudes, super stamina and maximum effort!

We had a great session in cricket this week, learning how to bowl with accuracy. The children learnt how to bowl over arm, and aim directly for the wickets with some great results.

Our English continues into next week as we look at various non-fiction sources related to the Romans. In grammar we are focussing on prepositions and pronouns and have a few fun songs to help us remember them.

As well as this, we were excited to begin the Easter story which we will be performing at the start of April. The children have been learning their lines, thinking about intonation and projecting their voices as well as practising the songs.

Finally, we have been celebrating each others efforts in Reading Plus and Times Table Rockstars with some children already turning their heatmap green! Have a wonderful weekend every-

Classroom News!

- EYFS We have had a busy week in EYFS this week. The children looked fantastic for World Book Day on Monday. We also started our new book; The Sacrecrow's Wedding. Mrs Buckley brought it to our class along with an invitation a wedding! We have read the book and started creating our own story map with actions to help us remember the story. In Maths, Reception has been ordering the days of the week, thinking about our school day and routine. In Nursery the children have read Six Dinner Sid and started to count to 6 and identify 6 on a ten-frame. On Tuesday we all had pancakes! We voted on what our favourite topping was; chocolate spread, jam or lemon and sugar and then made a class graph. Then on Wednesday we learnt all about Lent and wrote our lent promises; we thought about what we could give up or how we could be better in the future.
- Year One & Year 1&2 have had a great week. We really enjoyed World Book Day on Monday Two when we came dressed as heroes and villains. We started to learn about a new author, 'Beatrix Potter' in English. We have created a class knowledge box about her and written sentences that include conjunctions. In maths, we have been adding across ten, this has been a little challenging but we have been really trying hard. In geography, we have been discussing the Lake District and London. What are the physical and human features of both and how do they compare. We have enjoyed our PE lessons this week. We learnt how to bowl in cricket and we have been performing sequences in gymnastics. Well done Year 1&2!
- Year Five &This week Year 5/6 have been thinking about the Lenten period and what thisSixmeans to a Christian. The children have explored Lent, and they have identified a
list of things that the children could sacrifice during in his period.

In Geography, the children have been discovering settlements. They have explored their own settlements, as well as the settlements that are present with the Amazon basin, especially tribal communities. These communities live deep in the Amazon rainforest, and they rarely have contact with the outside world. The children will be discovering how the how the outside works has a dramatic impact on these tribes in the rainforests.

The children have been working with the adults this week to identify all their skills in mathematics and reading - the children have been very sensible and tried their best during this time.


