This Weeks Spotlight!

Year One & Two

What an exciting week Year 1&2 have had! We have been so busy practising for our Nativity performance. The children have shown great patience, determination and resilience learning all of the songs and their lines and they are almost ready for the dress rehearsal and parents' performances next week. This is when they will get to show all of

the school and their families what they have been working so hard on. In English, we started to read our new book, 'The Jolly Christmas Postman'. We have really enjoyed learning about all the fairy tale characters that the Postman visits and delivers letters to. The children even drew some lovely story maps from the beginning of the book to explain who he came to visit and what letters he left. Maths has been very interesting this week, as the children have been practising their number bonds to 10 and 20. We have been looking for patterns to help us remember them and to use in our addition work. As part of our 'preparations' topic in RE, we learnt about the Advent wreath, what it represents and how it is used throughout December in church. Well done Year 1&2, get lots of rest this weekend ready for our Nativity next week!





Classroom News!

- **EYFS** This week has been super busy for EYFS! We have been practicing our Nativity with Year 1 and 2. The children are absolutely fantastic and they can't wait to show you all their hard work next week. In English, we have continued reading our book The Snowman. The children independently sequenced the story and then we watched The Snowman film. In Maths, we have been looking at 4-sided shapes. The children explored how to make squares and rectangles then went on a hunt around the classroom to identify 4-sided shapes. This week the children added their candles to their advent wreaths, we lit the class advent wreath. We then spoke about how advent is a count down to Christmas day and Jesus' birthday.
- Year Three & Four This week in Year 3/4, we've been writing a diary entry from the point of view of a Victorian Miner. The children have explored the different thoughts, feelings and actions of a miner, while also considering the different dangers a miner might face the outcomes have been brilliant! In Maths, we've been adding and sub-tracting numbers up to 4-digits. The children have really embraced the challenges set this week and have flourished in the sessions. While in History, we've been exploring the consequences of the Skelmersdale Mining Disaster. The children worked in pairs to create their own breaking news bulletin about the crisis. Well done team on another brilliant week!
- Year Five & Six Year 5/6 have been working extremely hard this week, especially in Mathematics. The children have been investigating prime numbers, squared numbers and cubed numbers. They have used concrete objects, such as counters and cubes to help develop their understanding of 2 and 3 dimensional numbers (shapes). In English, the children have had a lot of fun creating their own hero and a mythical creature for their own ancient Greek myth narrative. They have also developed their characters by using a lot of synonyms to add detail and description. In PHSE, the children have been discussing peer pressure and making the right choice even when it is hard to do in front of their peers. We made beautiful angels for our hall display - 'A Choir of Angels'.
