This Weeks Spotlight! EYFS

We have had a busy week in EYFS! In Literacy we have continued to look at our non-fiction text What Can You See in Autumn? As a class we added more ideas to our spider diagram about autumn, using all the new vocabulary we have learned. Then we started to make our own fact file about autumn, using the pictures from the book we were able create sentences remembering capital letters and full stops.

In Maths Reception have been looking at one more using the story of the Gingerbread man; using counters to add one more each time a new character ran after him. We also looked at one less and sang the song 5 Little Speckled frogs. On Friday we looked at the composition of numbers up to 3, using farm animals and fields to explore this. Nursery have been exploring the number 2; what it looks like, showing it on fingers and sorting items into 2 and not 2.

Also, this week, we have been speaking about what we can do to help the poor. As a class we had a discussion about sharing what we have and then we wrote a reverse Christmas list of all the things we could donate to charity to help others at Christmas. We have come to the end of our RE topic about Welcome. We had a chance to reflect on what it is to welcome someone into a family, school and church community. We also re-enacted a baptism, acting out the parts of the priest, mum, dad and godparents.









Classroom News!

Year One & Two

This week we visited a crime scene! We discovered that Evil Pea has been up to no good again in our school kitchen and has been upsetting all Mrs Jordan's fruits and vegetables. In maths, we have been finding parts, learning about subtraction and fact families. In RE, we have been looking at the role Godparents play in supporting a child's spiritual development and religious upbringing and in history, we have been looking at how long we have been alive and using a timeline to show key events in our life. Well done Year 1&2 for another great week!

Year Three & Four This week in Year 3 and 4, we've been busy with lots of exciting activities! In Maths, we've been practicing column addition and subtraction, and our recall of 2, 5, 10, and 4 times table facts is becoming much quicker. We also discovered what a square number is and explored its properties. In English, we focused on expanding our vocabulary and created our own glossary of new words. Some of our Year 4 pupils also read their Paddington stories to the children in Years 1 & 2. In History, we studied sources about Boudicca written by Roman historians and discussed how their biases might have influenced their accounts. Finally, in PE, we started learning football skills, focusing on using the whole foot to control and pass the ball with accuracy. It's been a week full of learning and fun!

Year Five & Six

Year 5/6 have been very creative this week in class. The children have been discovering more about legends and they have been introduced to The Legend of Gelert. From the text, the children have produced a range of predictions based upon the information stated and implied in the text - some of their ideas were very imaginative and we could definitely write a new paragraph for the legend.

In Mathematics, the children have been using known facts to help with their addition and subtraction skills. They have also been completing some check-ins on Reading Plus. Those children who regularly complete the reading activities are making wonderful progress. Our French skills are also developing, as the children have been rehearsing how to explain what they look like.
