
This Weeks Spotlight!

Year Five/Six

Year 5/6 have began this new year with a lot of energy and excitement about their attendance award for the Autumn term. The children were able to bring in some comfortable pj's and they celebrated their attendance with a movie and hot chocolate. This really went down a treat, especially as it was a very cold day and the children were treated to cream and marshmallows on their hot chocolate as well as chocolate chip cookies.

In mathematics, the children have began our next unit of learning which involves multiplications and division. They have been using a grid method to multiply up to 4-digits to 2-digits and we will move onto using these skills to solve problems during the week. Some of the calculations have been very challenging this week but the children demonstrated resilience and hard work. In English, the children have been exploring classic fiction texts this week - we have had discussions about our favourite classic fiction novels and which movies they have seen that have been based upon a novel. One book we will be focusing on for the majority of this unit and many of the children have seen some adaption of the book - The Wizard of Oz.

Our Geography topic for this half term is Everglades. The children will exploring the coastline, wetlands and marshlands of the Florida coastline and discovering about the environment, the physical features of the landscape, as well as the climate conditions in the area. In RE, we have explored books and how we use these as sources of information. Our local Church unit of sources will help the children explore the world of books and the special book that we use in school, The Bible.



Classroom News!

Year EYFS

This week in FSU we welcomed some new pupils to our class and all of the children have shown 'Growing Together in God's Family' values and made our new starters feel very welcome! FSU have also enjoyed the colder weather this week and they had lots of fun freezing some pinecones and other natural materials and investigating how ice melts.

In literacy this week, the children were given the challenge of finding the Queen's missing hat! The children went on a hat hunt around the classroom and described the hats they found in full sentences and using descriptive language. In maths, Nursery have been learning to recognise the colours red and blue, and they have been finding objects to match the colours in the classroom. Reception have been learning about the number zero and practising subitising the numbers 1-5.

Year One & Two

Happy New Year! It has been lovely to welcome all the children back after the holidays, and I have really enjoyed listening to all the fun they got up to. It sounds like everyone had a lovely, well-deserved break.

We have had a fantastic first week back, and the children have settled in happily. We have started lots of new and exciting topics across the curriculum.

In English, the children have become fact-finders and are researching and learning lots of information about birds. We have been learning new vocabulary such as carnivore, vertebrate, nocturnal, talons, and species. Later in the term the children will be reading the novel, The Owl who was afraid of the dark. I hope the children are coming home and sharing all their fabulous bird facts with you.

In Maths, we are learning all about shapes. The children have been exploring 2D and 3D shapes and comparing their differences and similarities.

In Geography this term, we are learning about Skelmersdale and Port Douglas in Australia. This week, the children looked at a world map and labelled the continents and seas. They had a great time learning the continents song.

In Science this term, our topic is animals, including humans. Thank you for your continued support. Enjoy your weekend!

Year Three & Four

Year 3 and 4 have had a super, jam-packed first week back after Christmas! In English, we are enjoying our new topic on issues and dilemmas, exploring fun poetry, using drama to step into characters' thoughts and feelings, and raising thoughtful questions about their actions. In maths, we are delving deeper into multiplication and division by multiplying three numbers and choosing efficient methods. Geography is our new topic this term, and we have begun learning about the Lake District by recalling the countries of the UK, their capitals, and using our four-figure grid reference skills to locate them on a map. PE was lots of fun as we started creating a routine using Egyptian shapes, linking back to our History learning from last term.
