# This Weeks Spotlight!

### Year One & Two

What a lovely 1st week back Year 1&2 have had. We are enjoying our new English topic on the 'Rainbow Fish', the children have been sequencing the story and writing some brilliant setting descriptions. They have included amazing adjectives to describe the ocean and edited their work to make sure that their sentences make sense. In Maths, we have started learning about 2D and 3D shapes and in Science we had a walk around our forest school to look at some of the plants around school. In Art, the children posed in different positions and took photographs of them. They then sketched themselves in the pose using some new drawing techniques that they have learnt. In RE and PSHE, we have been learning about friendships, resolving disagreements and being sorry when we make the wrong choices. Another fantastic week Year 1&2, well done!



#### **Classroom News!**

- EYFS It has been a very exciting week this week in EYFS. The children have been looking at the topic People Who Help Us and the book Charlie the Firefighter. The children spoke about all different types of people who help us and thought about what they would like to be when they grow up. On Wednesday there was a special delivery from Skelmersdale Fire Station! We investigated the resources in the box and even dressed up as Firefighters! In Maths we have been working really hard on our number bonds to 10 and writing number sentences independently.
- Year Three & Four Wow, what an amazing first week back we have had in Year 3/4! On Tuesday, we had the most wonderful time visiting all the different animals at Chester Zoo. We got to explore in our small groups the Zoo; we even used our map reading skills to help the teachers find their way around. We used the iPads to take lots of photographs, which we are going to use in our artwork over the next few weeks. One of the highlights of our trip was exploring the bat cave. It was so dark and bats were flying around everywhere - one even had a wee on two of the children! The penguin exhibit was also very popular. The children loved watching the penguins dive in and out of the crystal-clear water.
- Year Five & Six This week has been very exciting for Year 5/6, as we have been looking at the summer production 'Robin and the Sherwood Hoodies'. They have been learning the lyrics to the songs and taking part in auditions for each role.

In English, the children have been developing their suspense/ mystery writing. They have used a stimulus for writing; by listening to music and looking at a range of images. The children are also very excited about our new DT project, especially after our success protein bars and packaging. Our new topic is ' habitats for insects' therefore, we will be making a range of 'bug hotels' for the insects around the school grounds.

#### **RE:** Payment of school trips

It is important to me as a headteacher that all children have the opportunity to attend trips no matter their financial circumstances. We will never leave a child behind. Saying that we are a business and cannot run trips at a significant loss. Mrs Wild has worked tirelessly to source funding through charities such as SVP, Peter Lathom Charity and school funding raising so that we can heavily subsidise the school trips. For example, the latest school trip cost:
