This Weeks Spotlight!

<u>Year 1 & 2</u>

It has been a lovely week in Year 1&2. The Year 2 children have been wonderful, helping the new Year 1 children to settle in. All the children have been getting to know their new classroom, routines and friends. We have started our new history topic, discussing significance and who is significant in our lives. We will look at this in more detail next week, focusing on a significant person.

In English, we have been reading a lovely story called Amazing Grace. The children have been role playing, making predictions and writing some super sentences. In maths, we have been sorting objects and subitising numbers up to 5. Our science topic is on materials and the children looked at a few common materials this week matching them up to their uses. Music, was enjoyed by all as the children found the rhythm and beat to their new song and in PE, we enjoyed running making sure we were on the balls of

our feet and using our arms to help us go even faster. Well done for a brilliant first week back Year 1&2!



Classroom News!

- EYFS Welcome back! EYFS have had a very busy week getting to know their classroom, friends and teachers. All the children have settled in really well. This week we have been looking at the book The Friendship Bench and had a present waiting for us on our bench in class. It is a story about a girl who starts a new school and wants to make friends. The children have been predicting what might happen next in the story and talking about what makes a good friend. We have also started our phonics and I am blown away with how well the children have done! We have also started our Maths fluency sessions to get us ready for Maths, this week we have looked at subitising the numbers 1, 2, and 3.
- Year Three & Four This week in Year 3/4, we've been learning about the cultural fairy tale Cinderella of the Nile. Before reading the story, the children have used the pictures to predict what they think will happen in it. Then, we read parts of our story to pull out key features. The children then compared our story to two other similar tales Cinderella and Prince Cinders. In RE, we have started looking at our families. The children have all had a go at drawing their own family tree and spoke about what makes our families special. It has been a fantastic start to the new year and I am so proud of all the hard work and kindness you have started the year with well done Team!
- Year Five & Six What a fantastic first week we have had in Year 5/6. The children have arrived at school looking extremely smart and ready for learning. This week we have been reading a variety of tales from 1001 Arabian Nights the children are really enjoying each story and we have begun discussing the themes and the language within each text. On Friday, we began reading our next text of 'The Golden Horsemen of Baghdad'. These texts will help the children to complete a narrative based on a similar theme. In Topic, we explored a range of images; the children have to guess what the images were of and then ask a range of questions about it. I must say, we so have some fantastic historians in our class, as they were looking very closely at all the minute details and expressing their thoughts on what the image was. In RE, we have begun exploring the word 'Love' and how God shows us His love every day.
