Year Five & Six

Welcome back everyone and here's wishing you all a wonderful new year. Year 5/6 started the year with great gusto, as they continued to work hard all week. We began the week by completing our persuasive argument based upon their choices of a theme park - the outcome was fabulous. Moving on in the week, the children were introduced to their new English writing topic of Science Fiction, which made many of the boys really pleased and a few of the girls also.

In mathematics, we continue our work with fractions and the children are now becoming familiar with equivalent fractions and placing them upon a number line. Our science topic is forces for this half term and the children have been exploring forces in actions in the classroom and their activities in class. They have been exploring friction, gravity, air resistance and upthrust. The children have also begun to investigate the area of 'mission' within their faith. They all researched a wide range of charities in the local area, which provide lots of help and support for members of our community. This is done through their personal beliefs of their mission for God. As we have had a lot of snow and ice this week, it has be hard for the children to not play outside, but two boys from our class have entertaining the others at lunch time with a bit of karaoke - thanks boys 🛛. Classroom News!

EYFS Welcome back! What and exciting week we have had with all the snow. The children are settling back in well and getting ready for their learning. This week we have started our new book The Storm Whale in Winter. We have spoken about the characters of Noi and the Storm Whale; what they look like and how they feel during the rescue. We have also learnt lots of facts about whales and spoken about storms. In Maths, Reception have been looking at the numbers 0 - 5 and learning how to subitise them, different ways of making them and what does zero look like. Nursery have been looking at the number 3; they have made 3 with cubes, practices showing it on their fingers and finding 3. Our new RE topic is Celebrating and we have looked at different types of celebrations and what we need to plan a party. On Wednesday we had a class welcome back party, with dancing and cake.

- Year One & Two Year 1&2 have started the new term really well. In English, we have started reading our new book 'Zog' and the children have been writing questions, making predictions and retelling the main parts of the story verbally. In maths, we have been comparing numbers and recognising our tens and ones. In RE, we have been discussing the special people in our lives. Who they are and why they are special to us. We have started our new geography topic, and this week we have been learning about the equator and the North and South Poles. We have learnt about the temperature in countries near to them and why this happens. In PE, we have started our gymnastics unit and the children all enjoyed learning new balancing and moving skills. Well done Year 1&2!
- Year Three & Four We hit the ground running this week and everyone has worked really hard. In maths we have been rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000, we then practised estimating answers to questions using our rounding knowledge.

In English we have introduced our new book The Iron Man and in grammar we now know when to use the articles 'a' or 'an' - ask me what the rule is at home!
