REFLECTION

We are now some distance from Easter, but the season is still permeated with the Easter message: Christ is risen, we are baptised in him. Today a new dimension of the story comes out - Easter is not complete until the risen Lord has returned to the Father and sent the Holy Spirit.

So, in today's Gospel we begin two weeks of looking forward to the coming of that 'Spirit of truth' which sets us apart from the world. In today's reading Jesus offers encouragement to his disciples, who will soon see him crucified. He reassures them that even though he will leave them, he will not abandon them. Instead he will send them the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, through whom the disciples will continue to live in union with Jesus. Jesus uses the term *Advocate* to describe the Holy Spirit, whom the disciples will receive. Note that Jesus says that he will send "another Advocate" Jesus himself is the first advocate, interceding for his disciples with the Father.

He contrasts his own impending departure with the permanence of the gift of the Holy Spirit - Jesus will leave to return to the Father, but the Holy Spirit will remain with the disciples. Through the gift of the Holy Spirit, the disciples will come to know and appreciate the unity of the Son and the Father. They will also understand that they too participate in the communion between the Father and the Son: "On that day you will realise that I am in my Father and you are in me and I in you" (John 14:20). The mystery of the Trinity can be difficult for us to grasp.

Today's Gospel invites us to consider how the three Persons - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit - work together so that God's salvation is made known to us. Jesus' mission is continued through the activity of the Holy Spirit in the lives of his disciples. We have received this same Spirit through our Baptisms. The Spirit, living and working within us, reveals the mystery of God's love for us.

Just as the first disciples were not left orphaned, we are not orphaned; we remain in God's embrace through the gift of the Holy Spirit.

CORONA VIRUS - IMPORTANT UPDATE

All public Masses, sacraments and other services are suspended until further notice (this will be reviewed regularly by the Bishops). The obligation to attend Mass on a Sunday and Holy Days is also suspended at this time.

This coming Thursday is a Holy Day of Obligation - or would be under normal circumstances! Please do make every effort to tune in to our Church Livestream if you are able and to make this a special day of prayer joining it with Pope Francis' appeal for people of all faiths to unite in prayer, fasting, and works of charity for an end to the Covid-19 pandemic.

Exceptions are as follows:

- Funerals will take place with restrictions fulfilling pastoral needs.
- The Sacrament of the Sick will continue in extreme circumstances, however, Holy Communion to the sick and housebound is suspended until further notice.
- The Sacrament of Reconciliation can be arranged in extreme circumstances by phoning the presbytery.

The Parish will maintain links with our parishioners in the following ways:

- Masses will be streamed live - the times will be as on the newsletter. Please note: we are currently experiencing some difficulties with the live stream at peak times relating to the volume of people trying to access the system. - A telephone conversation service (ChorleyBuddies) is now available for those who are self-isolating, further details can be found on the Parish Website.
