

## LOURDES AT HOME 2021

The Liverpool Archdiocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes was due to take place during the week 25-30 July 2021 but was cancelled due to the pandemic. The organisers have instead arranged a Lourdes at Home Pilgrimage Programme to take place from Sunday 25 July to Friday 30 July. Archbishop Malcolm will celebrate the opening Mass in the Metropolitan Cathedral at 3.00 pm on Sunday 25 July and the pilgrimage will conclude with a picnic followed by the Rosary and Torchlight Marian Procession in Our Lady's prayer garden, Southport Road, Lydiate from 6.00 pm on Friday 30 July. ## REFLECTION

In today's Gospel we hear about the return of the Twelve, who were sent by Jesus to preach repentance, heal the sick, and drive out demons. When the Twelve returned, Jesus invited them to come away from the crowds and rest - but the crowds wouldn't give them any peace. As the Twelve had shared in Jesus' ministry, they now appeared to share in his popularity! In an effort to get away, Jesus and his disciples boarded a boat in the hope of finding a deserted place, but the crowds noticed this and arrived ahead of them. The crowds were so persistent that Jesus and his disciples couldn't find any place to be alone. St Mark tells us that Jesus was so moved with pity, he began to teach the crowds himself. As we know from the gospels, there were always demands being made on Jesus and on his time. Many who were sick waited and queued so that he could lay his hands on them. He spoke to the crowds whenever and wherever he could; he spoke and taught in the synagogue and the Great Temple, he spoke to the people on the sea shore and from the hills. He sought out the poor and the sick so that he could be with them and eat with them. Not an easy life! There were times in his daily life and ministry that Jesus simply needed to get away from the crowds and all their demands. These were the times when he went off by himself to be silent, to rest and to pray. Jesus sought the same rest and relaxation for his own disciples as he seeks for us today! Family demands can make us feel like Jesus and the Twelve. We wish for times of relaxation and renewal, but there are always errands to do, household chores to keep up with, other commitments to fulfil - these are all good things but there are times when need to stop what we are doing, we need to be silent and we need to pray. Perhaps we might take the opportunity this week to give ourselves permission to find the same rest and relaxation that Jesus sought for his disciples. Let us pray that we may never be so busy that we cannot find some time each day to be silent, to rest and to pray. Jesus did, so why can't we?

## PARISH NEWS & EVENTS

### COVID 19 - CHANGES FROM 19TH JULY

In the light of further guidance received from the Archdiocese, going forward, the following will apply at both St Gregory's & St Oswald's from **Monday 19th July 2021**

- The wearing of facemasks will be **mandatory** for those attending all church services (except in the case of medical exemption).
- Social distancing will no longer be mandatory but taking into consideration that some people may still have concerns given the current infection rates, a section of the church will remain with social distancing restrictions in place.
- Hand sanitising will remain a requirement on entering the church but not on exit.
- We will no longer be taking details for track and trace purposes.
- Holy Communion will revert to the normal time and place in the Mass.
- Holy Communion under both kinds will not be re-introduced at this time.
- Stewards will invite people to the altar to receive Holy Communion row by row.

### CHANGES TO MASS/SERVICE TIMES

I asked a small group from both parishes to both consider the needs of their own parish and also the needs of the other parish in looking at the provision of weekday Masses going forward. I am very grateful to them all for their thoughtfulness and their suggestions. After discussion, it has been agreed that the following will be implemented from **1st August 2021**

SATURDAY: **HOLY MASS** 10:00am (St Gregory's)
