REFLECTION

Advent can often lose its focus and get forgotten because of all the other things that demand our attention at this time of the year. The readings on this, the 4th Sunday of Advent give us an opportunity to take Christmas seriously and with that comes a new vision. Today many of us seek fulfilment and happiness through 'doing our own thing'. We sometimes believe that happiness lies in having no commitments, no one to answer to, nobody else's problems to solve - no duty! But there can be a lot of selfishness in the 'do your own thing' approach. It often means taking the easiest path in the belief that this is the road to true happiness – in reality it's more likely to lead to unhappiness! True happiness and fulfilment are more likely to be found in the acceptance of duty or to be exact, in the loving acceptance of duty. In this Mary gives us a great example. She didn't say to the angel, 'Sorry, but I have my own plans. I want to do my own thing.' Instead she said. 'It's not what I want, but what God wants that matters - let what God wants be done to me.' Mary made a complete gift of herself to God, and accepted the task he gave her and even though she didn't understand all the implications of it, she knew that God would give her all the help she needed. She trusted so deeply in God that she was open to all possibilities and gave up control over her future and let God define her life. Life imposes a lot of duties on us all. Besides duties to ourselves, we have duties to others, and duties to God. Where would the world be if we only thought of ourselves, and insisted on doing our own thing all the time? If we choose to accept duty lovingly and say 'Yes' as Mary did, we may not find happiness and fulfilment in the eyes of the world, but we

will certainly find it in the eyes of God. All God asks is that we follow Mary's example and say 'Yes' - in our

families, in our community and in our world. Just as God called and chose Mary, God calls and chooses each of us. So, following Mary's faithful example, let us bring Jesus into our needy world of today.

PARISH NEWS & EVENTS

LOCKDOWN 2 - TIER 3 UPDATE

Following the latest government guidance, Public Worship services have now resumed. Restrictions remain in place include the wearing of face masks, hand sanitisation and giving personal details for track and trace purposes. Social distancing of 1 metre+ will be observed. People who have had any symptoms of COVID 19 should not attend for at least 14 days after the symptoms first appeared.

Funerals will still be permitted to go ahead but should be kept to close family members only (max 30 people).

Burials of ashes can also continue with up to 15 people in attendance.

Weddings will <u>not</u> be permitted to take place at this time (except in danger of death).

Baptisms can still go ahead <u>but may only be attended by people from the household of the child being baptised</u> (max of 6 and godparents will have to be by proxy).

NB: There is no option in Tier 3 for outside baptisms.

Masses will also continue to be LiveStreamed at the advertised times.

Weekday Masses:

Mon/Wed/Fri - 8:30am Tues/Thurs/Sat - 10:00am

Sunday Masses:

9:30am (Public Worship) & 11:00am (LiveStream)

Devotions will continue to take place on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 1:00pm - 2:00pm and will be LiveStreamed only.

CHRISTMAS MASSES 2020

There will be 3 Christmas Masses this year, Christmas Eve at 7:00pm and 9:00pm and Christmas Day at 9:30am. As the numbers at each service are restricted in line with government guidelines, unfortunately this year these will need to be ticketed events. Requests for tickets must be made in writing stating the number of tickets required, the names of those attending and a contact address and telephone number.

Please also state your preferred Mass time and whether you would like to receive your tickets via email, post or collection. Tickets will be allocated to those who regularly attend Mass in the first instance. Those attending must be in their seats at least 5 minutes before the start of Mass.
