#### REFLECTION

How often do we tell somebody something that has happened to us only to find we are not believed! We share with others an experience in good faith, hoping to be listened to and believed, but then the exact opposite happens. In today's gospel we hear about Jesus returning to his hometown of Nazareth after performing great miracles. Despite these powerful signs and the teachings Jesus conveyed in the synagogue, the people there still expressed disbelief. The main reason for their lack of faith was their close familiarity with Jesus. They could not fathom that the 'carpenter, the son of Mary' whom they

had seen grow up in their midst could be such an extraordinary prophet and even the Messiah! As Jesus sent out his disciples, he prepared them for the possibility of such a response to their message - either they would be welcomed and be able to carry out their ministry fruitfully, or they would be rejected and their ministry would not be accepted. But Jesus was not asking them to do anything he hadn't already done or experienced himself. The fact that not everyone who heard him accepted his message and often he was rejected was not surprising as his message was and still is very challenging. The message Jesus gives us all is one of mercy and compassion, love of strangers and even enemies, forgiveness, and concern for the poor and neglected. Jesus called each of his disciples personally and then sent them out in his name - he trusted them with the responsibility of carrying on his mission and ministry. Today, Jesus calls each of us by our name and entrusts us with the same responsibility. The mission and vocation to

hear and share the good news of the gospel and the responsibility of promoting and building the Kingdom of God belongs to all of us. We should not be discouraged if people do not listen to us. Is it not most difficult to bear witness to our faith among those who are closest to us? Jesus himself experienced the alienation of those closest to him so if you are experiencing that too, just remember Jesus can relate to your situation and he can provide

strength and comfort to you.
