We will be celebrating Black History Month throughout the month of October. On Monday 30th October we will have a day of celebrating (see attached letter).

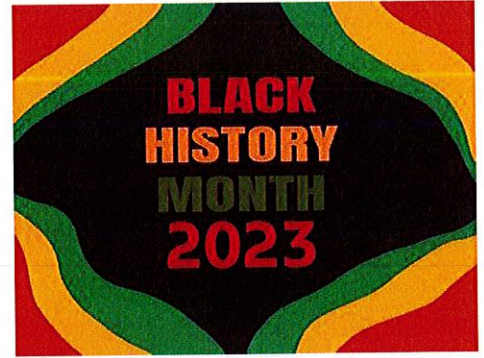
