The PE and Sport premium is used to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport that we can offer our children. As part of our long-term vision we aim to:

|  | Embed physical activity into the school day through active travel to and from school, active playgrounds and active teaching. |
|  | Raise the profile of PE and Sport across the school as a tool for whole school improvement. |

Children in reception demonstrate advanced motor skills through their exposure to tools at Little Leaves. Swimming at St Joseph's Worcester

Our swimming programme runs for the following year groups:

Year 4 – Autumn Term
 Year 3 – Spring Term
 Year 2 – Summer Term

Our data is reported for Year 4 children. Anyone still unable to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over at least 25 meters will receive additional swimming provision over and above the national curriculum requirements.
