



### Did you know?

Just a mile outside the city centre in Worcester is the biggest fish pass of its kind in England and Wales.

### Give your class a unique perspective on the River Severn

over 20 species of wild fish spotted here!

This fish pass has been built to help an endangered migratory fish swim up the River Severn from the sea each spring to reach good spawning habitats.

### Your class visit is relevant to these topic areas:

# Habitats Rivers STEM & Lifecycles Local history & geography m

See inside the huge fish pass structure



Step onto a manmade island in the middle of the river!

### Outline of your visit ...

### Arrive at Diglis Island for a 10.00am start

- Learn about the River Severn, its fish, the weirs and what we are doing to help
- Do a hands-on STEM activity, using engineering principles to design a structure and help the fish
- Take a guided walk on the river path to find out about Britain's longest river
- Visit the fish pass see this huge structure and think about the engineering involved in building it
- See through our special window into the river

We hope you will be lucky and spot fish but they are wild animals and don't arrive on cue. Our fantastic Explorers guides will bring their story to life! Schools are invited to visit on Wednesdays in Summer and Autumn terms.
