Dear Parents

As we come to the end of what has been the most surreal of years, I cannot express my thanks enough to you all for keeping your children safe and for working with us as we have mapped our route through this whole situation. My thanks also has to go out to the whole staff of the school as without them, what we have provided would not have happened.

Looking at the year group pages, I am so proud of what is being provided for your children to help them in their transition to their next class. Please do take the time to look with your child, they will find out about their new teacher and have the opportunity to send special work to them too. Mrs Yeomans has worked with teachers to enable all of this lovely work and information to be available for you. Huge thanks there!

This week has seen the return of Years 2, 3 and 4 albeit for a couple of hours but how special for them to be able to say goodbye to their teachers. It was so lovely to see them and I know that the teachers in Years 2,3 and 4 have had a lovely time.

Thank you to those of you who responded to the survey that was sent out last week. The results were very encouraging and will enable us to build on this experience for the good of the school.

Following my previous letter, some of you have contacted us regarding the situation with staggered drops offs in different places. The main focus behind this is to avoid unnecessary congregating of parents. The easiest way would be for any parent who wishes to, to drop all of their children at the earliest time they need at the one gate thereby allowing them to leave. We will ensure that the children are taken to their 'bubble' in the safest way possible. We can see how this all works in September but the most important issue for me is to ensure the safety of all concerned. As time passes in September, we will continually evaluate and respond to the situation to ensure that we continue to keep our school safe.

You will have received notification for your child regarding the 3rd and 4th September, which group and days they are required to be in. Home learning will be provided over the Thursday and Friday to be completed and brought into school when they next attend. These days will NOT affect your child's attendance. Your child will be expected to attend school on their allocated day. All children will be in from 7th September 2020

Thank you to those of you who have contacted me about wrap around care, you will be informed before September of the plans. The planned start date for this will be Monday 7th September 2020. I look forward to speaking to those of you who will join me for Zoom on Friday 17th July.

This just leaves me to say thank you again and to wish you a happy summer whatever you will be doing. I look forward to seeing you all in September.

Will my child have a lunch in September? If your child is in Reception, YR1 or YR2 from September your child will receive a cold lunch service from school. There is no need to order, this will be provided from Thursday 3rd September.

If your child is Pupil Premium the same will apply, a packed lunch will be provided until it is safe to return to a full hot service.

Menu Information

Please note that due to the current Covid-19 situation and the ever changing guidelines from the government we will not be distributing a hot menu at the moment.

Therefore from Thursday 3rd September for all children in Key Stage 1 & Pupil Premium, we will be operating a cold service. We will of course take into account any dietary requirements.

At St. Josephs we always like to go the extra mile and our staff are passionate about how we can provide a healthy cold service in September. On return to school our cold service will have a choice of 3 fillings: ham/cheese/tuna. Alternating between rolls/wraps/pitta, along with a selection from yogurts, fruit, veggie sticks, a homemade cake, biscuits or jelly.

All Key Stage 2 children will need to bring a packed lunch on their allocated day, either Thursday 3rd or Friday 4th September

Y3 in SEPTEMBER

When your child begins Y3 they will not be entitled to a free meal unless they qualify under the benefit related scheme (Pupil Premium) if your child does not qualify for a meal and you would like to pay for a cold packed lunch in September, please pay online by Friday 4th September for the following week.

What have we been doing?

Since school closed in March, our first thoughts were our children's meals, so we worked hard with suppliers to make up food parcels, which were collected from school.

Bury stepped in and helped deliver food parcels to vulnerable children & parents isolating.

We have been cooking for keyworkers & vulnerable children throughout the pandemic and enjoyed getting to know the children.

All this would not have been possible without dedicated kitchen staff so a huge thank you to Mrs Hancox,


Mrs Ovalle-Torres & Mrs Lane.
