Important Information regarding Confirmed Positive Cases...

Close contacts will now be identified via NHS Test and Trace and we will no longer be expected to undertake contact tracing.

Following a confirmed PCR test, NHS Test and Trace will work with you to identify close contacts. This is likely to be a small number of individuals who would be most at risk of contracting COVID-19 due to the nature of the close contact. School may be contacted in exceptional cases to help with identifying close contacts, as currently happens in managing other infectious diseases.

Individuals are not required to self-isolate (link to guidance: Stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection) if they live in the same household as someone with COVID-19 (unless they work in NHS), or are a close contact of someone with COVID-19, and any of the following apply:

- they are fully vaccinated; this means 14 days have passed since their final dose of a COVID-19 vaccine given by the NHS
- they are below the age of 18 years and six months
- they have taken part in or are currently part of an approved COVID-19 vaccine trial
- they are not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons

Instead, they will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace, informed they have been in close contact with a positive case and advised to take a <u>PCR test</u>. Can I urge you to arrange the PCR test if advised to do so and isolate until the result is received.

The isolation period is now 10 days from the date of symptoms / test if no symptoms.

SCHOOL RULES

Long hair below shoulder length should be tied back for school – this applies to boys and girls.

There has been an increase in the variety of earrings being worn lately, please may we remind you that only 1 pair of small studs are to be worn and they must be removed or taped up by the child for all PE lessons. Teachers cannot remove or help with earrings. Pupils may only wear items of religious significance e.g. cross and chain, Medugorje medals, pin badges, prayer bracelets but NO rings.

Please can we remind children that their belongings should be brought into school in either a drawstring bag or a book bag and not in backpacks or handbags.

Uniform will continue to be monitored and addressed accordingly.

Neighbourhood Matters! West Mercia Police launches community messaging system...


The new system, called Neighbourhood Matters, enables residents, businesses and community groups across Herefordshire, Worcestershire, Shropshire and Telford to find out more about what is happening in their local community. It also gives them the opportunity to contact police officers and local policing teams directly so they can raise any concerns and provide feedback.

It is a free service and those who sign up can choose to receive news and appeals, local crime information and crime prevention advice via a number of different channels.

The messages people receive will be targeted and based on their location and preferences selected by each individual. The public can sign up for local updates from their neighbourhood policing team, or join a number of specialised community interest groups such as Business Watch, wildlife crime and crime prevention.
