

# How To Plant A Sunflower Seed

## What you need:

- A small pot
- Soil
- Seeds
- Watering can
- Water

## Top Tip:

Water the soil everyday to help your sunflower grow.

## What you do:

- I. First, fill the pot with soil to just below the top.
- 2. Then, add a little water to the soil.
- 3. Next, carefully put I or 2 seeds onto the soil.
- 4. Cover the seeds with a little more soil.
- 5. Finally, gently pour more water onto the soil.



# How To Make Fruit Pizzas

## You will need:

- Digestive biscuits
- Natural yoghurt
- 3 4 different types of fruit e.g. Apple, banana, grapes, orange
- Plate
- Spreading knife
- Sharp knife
- A grown up!


## What to do:

- I. First, place your biscuits on the plate.
- 2. Then, spread the yoqurt onto the biscuit.
- 3. Carefully cut up the fruit into small pieces.

  (Ask a grown up to help you with the sharp knife)
- 4. Finally, put the fruit on top of the yogurt. Enjoy!

## How to make playdough

### What you will need

- 1. 8 tbsp plain flour
- 2. 2 tbsp table salt
- 3. 60ml warm water
- 4. Food colouring
- 5. I tbsp vegetable oil





#### Method

- I. Mix the flour and salt in a large bowl. In another bowl mix the water and a few drops of food colouring and the oil.
- 2. Pour the coloured water into the flour mix and bring together with a spoon.
- 3. Dust a work surface with a little flour and turn out the dough. Knead together for a few minutes to form a smooth dough.
- 4. Store in a plastic sandwich bag (squeeze out the air) in the fridge to keep it fresh.
