






## Spring 2 Homework

<p>We are in the Liturgical season of Lent. Write a Lent prayer using the following structure: Praise, Ask, Sorry, Thank you, Adoration. Think about what you are grateful for this Lenten season, how you will prepare yourself for the coming celebration at Easter, will you give anything up for Lent?</p> 	<p>This half term we are learning about Rivers. Research the River Severn that runs through Worcester. Draw a diagram to explain the journey of the river from its source to the mouth. Label the diagram.</p> 	<p>World Book Day is this half term. Let's help each other discover a range of exciting books. Create an advert for a book you have enjoyed recently. We will display these at school to inspire each other. Include the title, author and a brief overview of what the book is about.</p> 
<p>For Science we are learning about solids, liquids and gases. Make a list of each that you can find around your home. Present your findings in a table.</p>	<p>Practice your sketching skills. Arrange a selection of fruits or vegetables to sketch. Remember a sketch only uses pencil. Do not colour it in. Keep the pencil light and build up layers of lines.</p>	<p>In English we are looking at a diary. Write your own diary entry for your weekend. Make sure you write in the 1<sup>st</sup> person (I did this, I did that) and write in chronological order.</p> 
<p>The season of Lent begins with Shrove Tuesday and Ash Wednesday. Explain these 2 days and what happens on them and why. You could show your work as a poster or a power point. You may include pictures and drawings to help you explain the traditions.</p> 	<p>Research Easter traditions from around the world. How do other countries celebrate this event?
