I hope everyone is well and staying safe. I am writing today with a more general newsletter to update you on a range of topics.

Accessing Home Learning

We are trying to look at as many ways as possible to help our pupils access online learning during this time. Information has been sent out about using an X Box or Playstation to access the internet and Seesaw, and also about the offer to provide extra data for mobile phones. If you need any further information about either of these please contact school. If your child does not have access to a device that they can use for Home Learning, please let school know by Friday 15 January. I cannot promise that we are able to provide a device but we will certainly do our best to help.

New Home Learning

As per last week's letter, we will now be uploading the new Home Learning on a Friday evening/Saturday morning. At this point the previous week's learning will be removed and it will no longer be readily available. I would encourage you to download anything you may need before Friday evening.

Free School Meals

Free School Meals are in two different categories:

- Universal Free School Meals which are generally provided to all infant school children. The government is not providing these during lockdown.
- Means tested Free School Meals. These are still being provided and I will be sending a letter out in the next day or so to let those families who are entitled to them know how we will manage this going forward.

The circumstances of many families will have changed recently and it may be that you are now entitled to claim for Free School Meals. We have started a series of videos called 'Pause For Thought' which have a wellbeing and mindfulness focus. New videos will be added on a weekly basis and we will update links to sites as we discover them, so do keep checking.

Facebook

We have a school Facebook page which I know many of you already access. We have restarted our story time videos and these will be posted on Facebook several times a week. I also try to add information onto the page which I feel our parents may find useful. If you have not already discovered the page, I would urge you to have a look.

Critical Worker Provision

I will no longer be sending out booking forms to all families on a weekly basis. These will be sent out only to families who have been accessing the provision. However, if at any point you need to access this, please contact school and I will email a form straight out to you.

This provision is here for those children of Critical Workers who **need** a place. Here at St. Michael's we are absolutely committed to providing this for those children who **need** to be in school and have no other safe option. However, the Government advice on this is clear: if you have the option to have your children at home (eg. if one parent is working from home, or there is a responsible person at home able to look after them, even if they are working from home) then this is the safest place for them and others. The more children we have in school the higher the chances of us having a positive case. This would result in a bubble being closed down which may ultimately mean that the key workers who have been accessing the provision are not able to work, and provide vital services, as they will have children at home who need to isolate. I would ask that you consider very carefully whether your child does need a place.
