ENGLISH

Non-Chronological Reports

The children will be learning how to write a non-chronological report. It is a type of text which isn't written in time order. They are normally nonfiction texts which give information on a particular subject or event, without referring to the order in which things happen.

When the children are first introduced to non-chronological reports, they will be given a number of examples to read through and analyse. We will encourage them to select the characteristics and features that they all share.

Poems with Figurative Language

You can use figurative language in poems to help you create a clear image in your mind. Figurative language is a kind of descriptive language that doesn't mean what it says literally.

Here are some figurative language techniques:

- Similes describe something by comparing it to something else, using like or as. For example: The grass was as green as an emerald.
- Metaphors are words or phrases used to describe something as if it actually is something else. For example: He was a ray of sunshine.
- Personification is when we describe objects as if they act and feel like people do.: The flower drooped sadly towards the soil.

You could also support at home by hearing them read and talking to them about what their books are about.

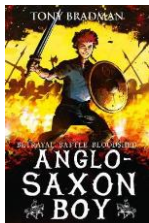
Encourage your child to learn their weekly spellings.

SCIENCE

Forces



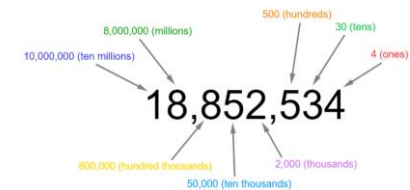
This Forces in Action Year 5 Science topic teaches your children how forces affect everything around us. They will learn about the effects of gravity, friction, air and water resistance.

- Children will learn through a range of investigations; examples include:
- How a toy car travels over different surfaces (investigating surface friction).
 - The best shape and size for a parachute (investigating air resistance).

MATHS

Place Value

In Year 5, your child will be reading, writing, and comparing numbers up to 1,000,000. They will round large numbers, interpret negative numbers in lots of contexts, and learn Roman numerals up to 1000 (M).



Addition and Subtraction

Your child will solve problems involving numbers with more than four digits. They will be able to mentally solve problems involving large numbers, and will tackle longer multi-step calculations.

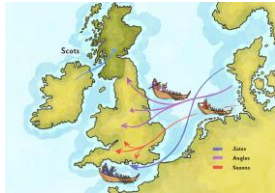
Statistics

Your child will learn to read and create number lines. They will interpret timetables and will solve problems using statistical information from graphs and charts.

HISTORY

The Anglo-Saxons

Find out what happened in Britain after the Romans left in the 5th century with these fantastic Anglo-Saxons history lessons. Acting like historians the class will explore where the Anglo-Saxons came from, how they came to settle in Britain, and much, much more.

ART & DESIGN

Leonardo Da Vinci

Knitted Knowledge

- Learn about the life and works of Leonardo Da Vinci.
- Explore his drawings of machines and inventions.
- Learn how his work has influenced other artists.

Super Skills

- Use collage to recreate colour, tone and depth.
- Create scenes using perspective.
- Design and create a 3D model of a machine.

FRENCH

Knitted Knowledge

- We will know how to name items of clothing in French.
- We will know that some nouns are masculine, others are feminine.
- We will know that adjectives of colour follow the noun in French.

Super Skills

- We will speak in sentences to make short, simple descriptions of school clothes.
- We will invent our own school uniform and present it in French in poster form.

PE

Swimming

Pupils focus on swimming more fluently and with increased confidence and control. Pupils work to improve their swimming strokes, learn personal survival techniques and how to stay safe around water.



Netball

Pupils will learn to use a range of different passes to keep possession and attack towards a goal. Pupils will be encouraged to work collaboratively to think about how to use skills, strategies and tactics to outwit the opposition. They will start to show control and fluency when passing, receiving and shooting the ball.

COMPUTING

Programming - Repetition in Games
