Are you aware of any families, with an unemployed adult in the home, who would benefit from family support to overcome the general challenges that they are facing? We know that barriers to employment come in many different forms and we need to address the wide range of issues a family may be experiencing before they can even consider their steps to employment. We know that some families do not meet the criteria for statutory support, or have just finished a period of support, but would benefit from a little extra help.

Did you know that, in partnership with The Education People and Kent County Council, we now have a Family Focused Employment Support Service as part of the Employment Support Hub for Canterbury and Thanet? Through this, Salus are able to work with whole families to address wide ranging issues that they may be facing. This could include debt management, housing, mental health, managing boundaries or any other challenge that arises for a family

Eco Garden



The Canterbury Satellite Students have been working on an Eco Garden this year. The idea was to reuse materials that have been thrown away to create an area for growing plants, encouraging wildlife and as an outdoor space for socialising too.

We have built two raised keyhole gardens from stones that were thrown into a skip on site and reused card, stick and shredded paper to line it. We have three composters for our daily food waste which is great for banana peels, grass clippings and tea bags. We thank the school for purchasing a willow dome which is providing a wonderful shaded area and quiet space, and also for the recycled benches.

A water tight box was submerged to make a pond which has a variety of insect life in it, and we scoured the site looking for pallets and old wood for our bug house. We have seen so many birds attracted to some feeders that were being thrown out. We have seen over 15 types of birds in the garden this year. After planting the sunflower seeds we noticed a molehill or two and realised moles love slugs, worms and sunflower seeds! Each week we devote an hour of time to eco club and students have enjoyed building, cutting, digging and planting this sustainable space which the whole block can enjoy. This was most evident when we hosted the Jubilee picnic and hung a plaque about our apple tree, which we planted for the occasion
