Dear Parents and Carers

The school is slowly returning to some sort of normality after more than a year of restrictions and disruptions. We know the virus is still with us and could again cause further difficulties and so we are continuing with the increased hygiene measures we have had in place, Lateral Flow Testing, staff wearing face coverings in the more social areas and vigilance around symptoms of the virus. Now that the weather is better we can begin using more outdoor spaces and access safely the community as part of our curriculum. We will start to use our dining hall again after the May Day holiday and we are already seeing more visiting professionals recommencing their work with children.

We also hope that we can organise sports days for late June or early July where you will be invited to the school to share the experience with your child. Once again thank you for all your support.

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
Lorna's hobbies are mountain biking and looking after Malcolm her cat.

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Letter from the Chair
