## Language Through Colour

## A visual aid to understanding text and formulating sentences

Who can this approach support? Language through colour can be used to support all children within the Early Years with developing vocabulary skills, interpreting and responding to questions and developing both their spoken and language and sentence construction skills.

Information is colour-coded according to the type of information it conveys, and each category is linked to a question.

Question	Colour	Type of words	Examples
Who?	Pink	People	Mummy
What?	Orange	Objects	Crayon
Where?	Blue	Places	Home
What doing?	Yellow	Actions	Walking
What like?	Green	Descriptions	Beautiful
When?	Brown	Time	Today
Why?	Purple	Reasons	Because


Below is an example of using language through colour to support verbal sentence construction, asking questions about a picture. Children are prompted by use of the question words to begin to verbally formulate their

ideas – Who is it? What is she doing? Where is she?
