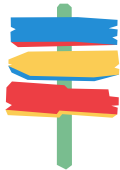
Welcome back to the summer term; here's hoping the sun puts in an appearance soon!

- The participants of our Sensory Champions course sharing the impact of the changes they have made following the learning sessions on the 16th May. We will share these at the SENCo forum, too.

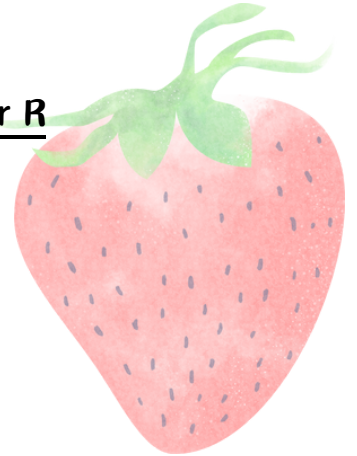

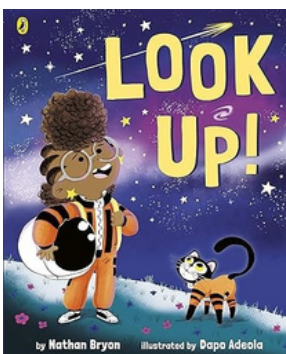
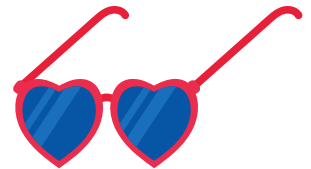
For Adults - Uniquely Human By Barry M Prizant with Tom Meyer
