Curriculum Intent:

At St Nicholas School, PSHE is taught in order to develop the qualities and attributes needed to thrive as individuals, family members and to be a part of society.

For students on the Oak Pathway this is achieved by learning the skills to:

- Form positive and long lasting relationships.
- Make safe and healthy lifestyle choices, both online and offline.
- Interact successfully with the wider world developing employability skills and preparing for adulthood.

The curriculum is delivered through whole class teaching, small group work and individualised learning targets. Learning takes place in the classroom and in the wider community. The opportunity for students to apply learning and practice skills in real life contexts is central to the curriculum and successful learning.

For students on the Oak Pathway lessons address the wider world implications of the components outlined below, taking students from the personal level to that of the community and situations outside of their direct experience. At Key Stage 4 students complete OCR Life and Living Skills accreditation to develop independent living and vocational skills.

ASSESSMENT AND IMPACT

Steps of progress are mapped against the KSENT CORE PSHE assessment framework, which reflects the core areas of the curriculum.

Individual targets are planned, delivered and assessed through students' provision plans.

The Boxall Profile is used to assess children and young peoples' social, emotional and behavioural development.

At KS4 students access accreditation that is externally assessed and appropriate to individual abilities, building on skills and knowledge from previous years.

The programme is accredited across KS4 using the ASDAN EL2 Employability Award as pupils submit the following units:
