The Arts Team



A Team of specialist teachers and T.A's in music, film and media, art and design and drama/ dance work across the school to design and deliver a range of activities in weekly lessons, lunchtime and after-school clubs, as well as school performances and events. The Arts Team often work on a specific project over the course of a term to create a final product such as a performance, exhibition or multi-media event. We have developed a sensory-immersive house style for school productions which suits the range of needs of our students.

Cronin Music Ltd provides professional standard I.T. relating to film, media and audio for children to use as well as professional expertise and advice. There is also a 'St Nicholas radio' run by the students.

All students in KS4 work on a Bronze, Explore or Discover Arts Award programme which includes arts activities and opportunities to see performances and visit galleries.
