Course Objectives: Accredited training (Level 2 or 3) to help you develop and improve the communication skills of all children and young people especially those with speech, language and communication needs.

Course Content: Supporting children with:

- Vocabulary difficulties
- Receptive and expressive language needs
- Unclear speech
- Developing effective interaction and social communication skills

Target Audience: TAs and CTs working in Primary Schools.

Venue: TBC

Cost: The 3 day course is free but if attendees wish to do level 2 or 3 accreditation a cost of £150 per person will be invoiced.

Cost is non-refundable if attendee does not complete the portfolio and is to cover accreditation fees and marking service.

ADHD (Attention Defecit Hyperactivity Disorder) - Tues 11th Oct - 9:30-12.30pm - Also available in TERM 4 Tues 7th March - 9.30-12.30pm - Only attend ONE session.

Course Objectives: This half day course is designed to support school staff that are working with children and young people who have a diagnosis of ADHD. The course is suitable for staff from Nursery Settings, Primary and Secondary Schools.

Course Content: Encourage open discussion about ADHD

- Give an insight to the difficulties and positive encouragement children and young people with ADHD experience
- Identify good practice and offer advice, strategies and support for children and young people
- Ways in which a Setting or School can be ADHD aware

Target Audience: Staff in Primary and Secondary schools and Early Years Practitioners.

A general understanding of autism prior to attending would be necessary.

Course Objectives: This session aims to explore how staff can support the emotional wellbeing of their autistic pupils.

Course Content

- The relationship between anxiety and autism
- How anxiety can impact on behaviour
- How to reduce the impact of anxiety on autistic pupils
- Strategies to support students to identify and regulate their emotions

ATTENTION AUTISM TM

Tues 15th & 29th Nov - 9am-4pm

Level 1 training - Copyright Gina Davies

This course equips attendees with the skills to set up and run the 4 Stage Attention Autism programme.

Please note you need to be able to commit to stay for the whole and day and to embed Attention Autism into your planning for a minimum of 3 times a week. You will receive 3 visits from the AA team over the year.

Target Audience: EYFS Practitioners in nurseries and schools.

Term 2

POSITIVE RELATIONSHIPS - Tues 15th Nov - 9.30-12.30pm

Course Objectives: This day course is designed to support school adults and how they can develop the skills to work with and support children and young people who are demonstrating extreme anxiety.

Course Content

- Encourage open discussion about values, beliefs and attitudes. Why do we find some behaviour challenging?
- Give an insight to Breakwell's Assault Cycle
- Identify and share good practice and offer advice, strategies and support for engaging positively with children and young people.
- How to observe and document evidence in order to plan support for a pupil

Target Audience: Nursery settings / Primary and Secondary schools staff.

Adverse Childhood Experience's & Trauma - Thurs 8th Dec - 9.30-12.30pm

Course Objectives: To support school staff that are working with children and young people who are experiencing or who have experienced adverse childhood experiences and trauma. The course is suitable for staff from Nursery settings, Primary and Secondary schools.

Course Content: Encourage open discussion about adverse childhood experiences and trauma.

- Give an insight into the difficulties children and young people with adverse experiences face
- Identify good practice and offer advice, strategies and support for children and young people
- Ways in which a Setting or school can develop wellbeing and positive relationships

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Term 3

ASD IN THE Early Years - TWO day course - 12th & 17th Jan 2023 - 9.30-2.30pm

Course Objectives: To gain an understanding of autism and the strategies and interventions used to support children who have a diagnosis of autism in the Early Years.

Course Content: What is autism?

- The impact autism has on children's communication, language and play skills - presented by SLT from NHS
- Creating an appropriate learning environment
- Developing effective support for children with autism in your setting
- Developing and writing a Social Story

Target Audience: Pre-School SENCo / Pre-School Manager / EY Practitioners / School SENCo / EY's CT / EY's TA

Venue: St Nicholas Training Centre, Canterbury

ASC PRIMARY - Fri 20th Jan - 9.30-3.30pm

Course Objectives: To provide an understanding of autism and an insight into how to support pupils with autism in the Primary School environment - ideal for any staff members new to working with autistic pupils.

Course Content

- To explore what it means to have autism and some of the theories behind it.
- To examine some of the common characteristics a pupil with autism may demonstrate in school.
- To consider the challenges a pupil with autism may experience in the Primary school environment. To explore strategies and best practice for supporting pupils with autism in a Primary school context.

Target Audience: Any member of staff within a Primary school who is new or just beginning to work with autistic pupils.

Venue: TBC

Cost: Schools - £50 per delegate.

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Term 3

ASC SECONDARY - Fri 27th Jan - 9.30-3.30pm

Course Objectives: This session aims to develop a good understanding of how the main areas of difference experienced by autistic students can impact upon them in Secondary school and the support they need.

Course Content

- A brief overview of the development of our understanding about Autism.
- The main areas of difference experienced by autistic people.
- The potential impact of these upon autistic students in the secondary school setting.
- Practical strategies to support autistic students.
- Opportunities to share our experience and reflect upon own practice.



What does the course cover?

The Cygnet Programme aims to give parents/carers information on Autism that reinforces what they are doing is OK and provide support and advice on Communication and Language needs, sensory needs, understanding and supporting behaviour in a supportive environment.

Joining criteria

Child must have a confirmed diagnosis of ASD and must attend a Canterbury City or Canterbury Coastal school. Parents have not attended the Early Bird

The second course is 'Puberty, Sexual well-being & Relationships' and is a 3 week course. To register interest or book, parents should use the STLS email address above and there is a booking for on our website [CLICK HERE](#)

This three session course is designed for parents/carer's of children/young people with autism aged 7-18, to help them develop their understanding and confidence relating to puberty, sexual wellbeing and relationships and how they impact children on the autistic spectrum.
