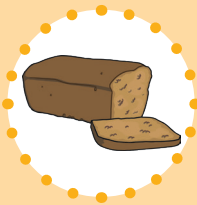

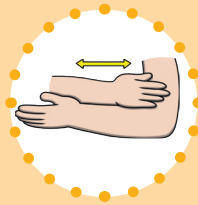

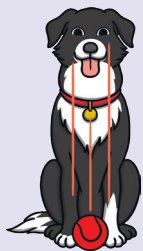
Grammar

This week, we have been revising the use of exclamation marks and practising when to use them in our own writing.



We know that a sentence can end in a **full stop**. We also know that when a sentence is a question, we use a **question mark** at the end. When we want to add feeling to our writing, we can use an **exclamation mark**. An exclamation mark is used to express a strong feeling, such as excitement, surprise, anger or joy.

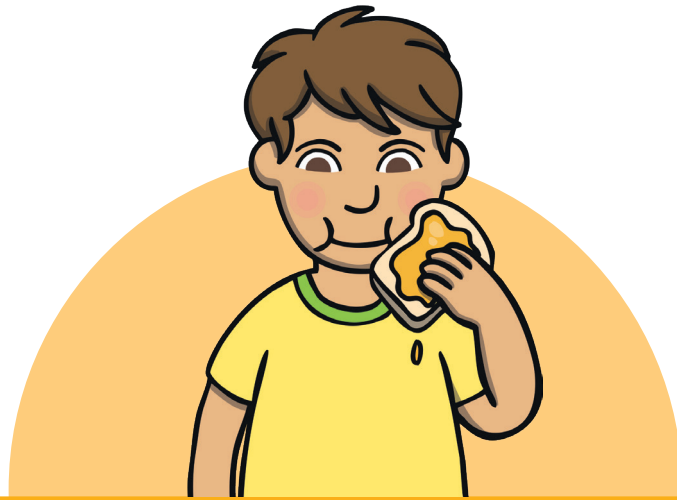
