The /igh/ Sound Family

This spelling is usually used y when the /igh/ sound is at the end of a word. It can sometimes be used when the /igh/ sound is in the middle of a word.

> dru reply



This is used in tie, pie, lie and die. All other uses are in suffixes when the sound is at the end, e.g.

spies, cries, replied.

tie pie lie



This spelling is often used i when the sound is at the start of the word and in words of two syllables or more.

> iris item silent



This spelling is used igh when the sound is at the end of a word or when the /igh/ sound is in the middle of a word and followed by a /t/ sound. siah night bright

i_e

This spelling is used when the /igh/ sound is the middle a word.

This is the most common spelling.




