The /n/ Sound Family

gn

This spelling is the most uncommon spelling for the /n/ sound.

In some words, the letter ${\bf n}$ has a ${\bf g}$ before it.

We don't say the /g/ sound in words with **gn** - we just say /n/.


It is used when the /n/ sound is at the beginning, middle or end of a word.



This is the most common spelling of the /n/ sound.

It can be used when the /n/ sound is at the start, middle or end of words.
