Adding **-ed** to words ending in **y**

When we add the **-ed** suffix to a word, it means the action has already happened.

Look at the letter before the **y**. Add **-ed** when it is a vowel before the **y**.

$$stay \rightarrow stayed$$

Replace the ${\bf y}$ with an ${\bf i}$ when there is a consonant before the ${\bf y}$.

Adding -ing to words ending in y

When we add the **-ing** suffix to a verb, it is talking about the action being done. Add **-ing** to the root word.

• A **verb** is a type of word that shows an action.

copy play annoy cry

• When we add the suffix **-ed** this changes the verb's tense, which tells us when the action is happening. Adding **-ed** changes the verb to past tense to tell us that it has already happened.

copied played annoyed cried

• When we add the **-ing** suffix to a verb, it is talking about the action being done. It can be happening now.

she is **copying**
